From the Principal

Northern Beaches Secondary College Student Leadership Day

This morning I had the pleasure of attending the Northern Beaches Secondary College Student Leadership Conference at Manly Golf Club. From the Deputy Principals

The HSC is well underway with many students completing half of their examinations. Students are reminded to see Mrs Whalan or speak to the Presiding Officer if they have any questions or concerns regarding illness or misadventure procedures. Students are encouraged to collect their Leavers card from the front office and ensure all outstanding resources, e.g. textbooks, are returned to the different faculty areas. Leavers cards must be completed by Thursday 10 November before Graduation folders are presented.

All parents, caregivers and family are invited to attend the Year 12 Graduation on Monday 14 November 2016 from 3:45pm for a 4pm start at Freshwater Senior Campus. Refreshments will be available after the ceremony so that staff can join with student and families in celebrating the successes of Year 12 2016 before students then leave for their Formal.

Year 10 students have two important deadlines to meet next week: Work Experience forms and Volunteering booklet are due to Mrs Rixon in the Career's office. The Problem Challenge has been given to students and they will be writing a 900-word response on Wednesday 2 November to the following stimulus: *write an expository application to be selected as an Australian Youth ambassador for a United Nations panel. You will need to discuss how your Year 10 studies have enabled the development of the mindset, skills and knowledge which the young people of your generation will require in order to flourish/progress in the future.*

The Digital Learning Portfolio is an opportunity for students to share their learning with an authentic audience of community volunteers. The dates for the presentations are Week 7 Monday 21 November, Tuesday 22 November. The presentation, during Week 7, is optional and students need to inform Mrs Whalan of their intention to present by Tuesday 1 November. We require volunteers from the community for this event. It is preferable that volunteers could come in half day or whole day blocks of time. Volunteers are required to be in the school library at 8.30am for a brief training session prior to the 9.00am start. Please contact me in the DP's office if you are available to assist.

One of the chapters in "Take Charge of Your Life" by William Glasser, a book I'm currently reading, is titled "Choice Theory Psychology and Raising

Children". Glasser recognises that parenting is a complex task and recommends parents "try as hard as possible to teach, show, and help your children to gain effective control of their own lives". He suggests that all irresponsible behaviours chosen by children as they grow up are their attempts to take control of their lives. To assist children in gaining better control of their lives, he recognises four procedures. The first two - *doing things for them* and *doing things to them* are to be avoided as they take control away from the child. The preferable procedures of *doing things with children* and *leaving them alone* are important at all ages and even more so as children grow older.

A new timetable for Year 12, 2017 commenced this week. Many students have adjusted their study pattern to include additional extension units in Mathematics, English, History, Japanese and Music. Other students have discontinued a course and have a reduced face to face timetable. It is vital that if students now have a greater number of 'free' periods, that these are used wisely and efficiently to work on assessments, homework and study notes. This effective time management will help deal with stress at the busier points in the year such as examinations. Students with 'free' periods during the day are not able to leave the school grounds and are expected to work in the library. Students who have 'free' periods at the start of the day, do not have to be at school at 9am nor do students who have 'free' periods at the end of the day need to stay until 3.20pm. Students will need to sign in and out on these occasions. Term 4 Assessment calendars were distributed to all students and an electronic copy uploaded to the school website. This calendar provides specific HSC assessment dates, along with key school events. Please note that the dates given in this document are subject to change for a variety of reasons. Class teachers will advise in writing of the precise timing at least two weeks before the task is to be administered. I encourage students to place this somewhere visible to assist with planning and preparing for tasks.

Year 7 and 9 students have a busy couple of weeks with assessments and assignments due. Students are encouraged to incorporate the study skills and resilience strategies they have learnt to enable them to achieve their *Personal Best*. If

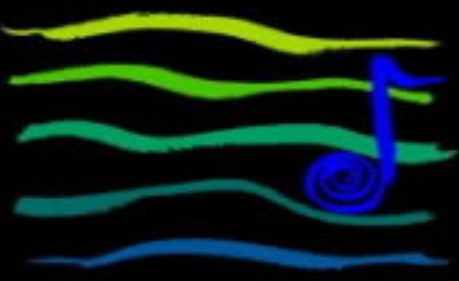

As part of our welfare curriculum at Manly, we support our students with the skills to stay resilient and bounce back from challenges.

Jacqui Pollock is a specialist family coach who works with parents at Manly running workshops on how to stay resilient and calm in challenging teen parenting moments.

Jacqui will run a workshop this December for our new 2017 parents with students starting in year 7.

Get ready over the holidays to transition to High School.

Learn HOW TO:

- Calmly navigate the change from pre-teen to teen years
- Explore the change in your role as parent
- Improve your teen's growing emotional intelligence – and reflect on your own skills too
- Support not rescue your child during the transition to high school

This workshop is designed specifically for Manly parents with children commencing in 2017. The workshop is run at school in the Common Room so parents get an opportunity to experience a day in the life of school at Manly, we even order our lunch from the canteen! It's a great way to meet other parents who will become your friends and community over the High School years.

The content will introduce you to the Parent Coach approach, and Jacqui will outline the concepts of her coaching program "How to Coach your teen in the game of life". There are various workshops run throughout the school years that expand this program to include: respect, listening, understanding, making agreements with teens, consequences, nurturing responsibility and independence.

Jacqui Pollock provides coaching and workshops for Leaders, Educators, Principals and Parents. She consults to Dept. of Education in NSW, SA and Victoria. Jacqui is co-author of the recently published book "Knowing Me, Knowing them - aha" which helps parents explore their parenting personality and how it impacts their family.

And she's also an ex Manly Selective parent whose daughter graduated in 2015.

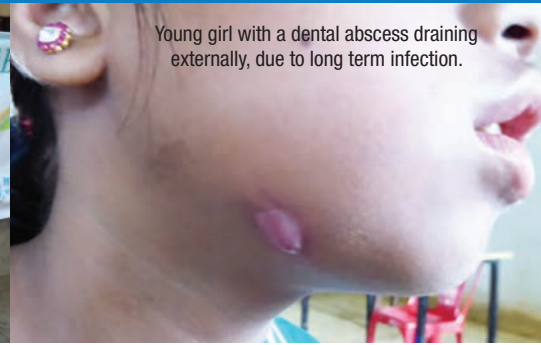
