From the Principal

Thank You to P&C

Once again, at this week's P&C meeting I was reminded of just how lucky our school is to have such a wonderfully supportive P&C Association. It was the annual 'budget' meeting and discussions centred around how to support students' learning and the school environment through the donations made by parents, and through the funds raised at the various school events during the year. Our P&C committed to support classroom needs, the Innovation Grant to the school, the grounds, the student Excellence Fund and, their major project for the coming years, an upgrade to facilities in the school hall.

We have a very dedicated group of parents; whether it be those who volunteer in the canteen, those who run student support programs in the school, lead student teams, volunteer for working bees, lead band programs ... the list is seemingly endless, and their work is truly appreciated.

The true value, however, is not simply in the material things that are donated or supplied to the school, it is in the support and care that is offered to our students every day by parents who care about their children, the school and our education system in general. A colleague once said to me "good things happen to good people". We certainly have many good people associated with our school and good, no great, things are happening.

I very much look forward to continuing to work closely with the P&C to ensure that their efforts translate into high class opportunities for our students.

While speaking of the P&C, there is an initiative being driven by some of our parents for more regular, social contacts to be made. In fact, our

Year 8 parents have a privately organised social gatherings coming up in the near future. There is also a drive for 'contact lists' to be developed so that more immediate contact can be made between parents of students in each year group. These are wonderful initiatives and it is heartening to see our parents getting to know the parents of their child's friends in a more social setting.

Band Program Performances

As we move closer to the end of the year, we will also have the opportunity to witness final performances by each of our band ensemble streams. Our Strings stream will have their final performance evening at the Mosman Art Gallery, our Jazz stream have been invited back to perform at *Events at Dee Why* and then of course there will be the Big Band Bash on the night following Presentation Night. I cannot recommend these performances to you highly enough; they are on a truly professional level. Please read through the band section of this newsletter for further details.

Executive Professional Learning Day

Earlier this week, each member of our school executive participated in a professional learning day refocusing on the literacy needs of our students across the curriculum. Keeping in mind that literacy is not the single domain of the English faculty, it is incumbent on us all to be kept up-to-date with the latest practices in the understanding and teaching of literacy skills. Each of us was required to complete a component of the Year 9 NAPLAN Literacy test and then go through a discussion process prior to marking. I must say, a very enlightening exercise indeed.

One reason for us to refocus on this is the upcoming changes to HSC requirements. There has been established a minimum literacy and numeracy standard required for students sitting

the 2020 HSC onwards. This affects students in Year 9 from 2017 who will be able to meet the standard by achieving Band 8 result or above in NAPLAN in reading, writing and numeracy. For students not meeting this requirement from 2018, an online literacy and numeracy test will have to be completed for students to demonstrate they have met this standard. The awarding of the HSC testamur will not be done until these literacy and numeracy requirements are met.

In 2016, we had a small number of students who did not meet this requirement – mainly in the area of NAPLAN Writing. These students will, in the future, be required to undertake the online test to qualify for a HSC. Obviously, for the sake of the students, we wish to avoid this through ensuring they meet the standard in Year 9. From this day, I am certain that our staff have a greater appreciation of the requirements of the NAPLAN test. Ongoing teacher support and development will continue to ensure we meet the needs of our students to achieve these results. Special thanks for the day must be passed on to our Head Teacher, Teaching and Learning, Ms Hewes and our Learning Support Teacher, Mrs Hutton.

From the Deputy Principals

With the HSC Examinations concluding next Friday it's almost time for Year 12 students to celebrate their achievements. The Year 12 Graduation will be held on Monday 14 November from 3:45pm at Freshwater Senior Campus. Students are requested to arrive by 3:45pm so that we can start the ceremony promptly at 4:00pm. After the ceremony, parents, students and teachers are invited to stay for the afternoon tea, kindly catered for by Year 11 parents, before Year 12 depart for their formal. All students are reminded to collect their Leavers Cards from the Front Office and complete their sign out by Friday 11 November at the latest.

Year 10 students are working on the Problem Challenge, which will be assessed next Wednesday during the ILP lesson. Those who have signed up will present their Digital Learning Portfolio to parents and community members during Week 7 on Monday 21st and Tuesday 22nd November. The presentations will take place in the library seminar rooms and will be 10-15 minutes in length. We are asking for volunteers who are able to give either one day or half a day

of their time to be involved in this very worthwhile program. I am sure you will appreciate the benefits that our students will gain by having an opportunity to display their work to an authentic audience. Year 8 students are highly active online and forming distinct internet identities whilst still developing an understanding of what impact their behaviours can have on themselves and their friends. On Tuesday this week, Year 8 students participated in an engaging and interactive Digital Citizenship workshop which focused on the distinction between intention and impact with online choices. Through the use of salient and authentic examples, the workshop helped Year 8 understand the complexity of the distinction between what was intended with posts/comments/uploads and the impact upon others and themselves, and how to employ strategies that will enable them to create a positive online identity and be a responsible digital citizen. Especially powerful was the discussion regarding sending and receiving inappropriate images, how to not be a cyber-bullying bystander and how to ensure your Facebook/Instagram/Twitter account does not cost you a job in the future. The feedback from the students indicated that the workshop would make them more mindful of the online choices they made and gave them several practical strategies to employ. Thank you to Ms Brien for support and organisation of this worthwhile learning opportunities for our students.

The dangers of multitasking were demonstrated and the benefits of sleeping were also reinforced. HOBBIES

There are 8 different hobby groups in each of the three forms. Fourth form pupils could take cooking (2 groups), leather work, copper work, model aeroplane building, motor car maintenance, photography, and stock market studies. Third form pupils could take body building, lapidary work, model building booking. Rug making, library studies, bridge or chess. Second form pupils could choose from sculpture work, motor maintenance, lapidary, library, chess, cooking orienteering or gardening.

The P&C, as usual, were great supporters of the scheme and donated several hundreds of dollars, and when this had to be split 24 ways we saw that we would have to be careful and seek outside assistance.

Cooking began with a science department hot plate and an old frypan, but soon a number of generous donations came in from parents. In addition, Mrs Symonds donated two new frypans, Mackellar Country Council donated six frypans and an electric range, while North Short Gas Co donated a modern gas range and a large supply of bottled gas to run it. Thanks again to all the people concerned.

Conducting the hobby periods has not always been an easy task. Many teachers have found the preparation work for it far more time consuming than for normal periods. Excellent and rewarding work has been done in many of the groups, but the greatest success has been with the 4th form groups where the numbers in each group are considerably smaller than those of 3rd and 2nd forms, and pupils have been able to change more easily from one group to another without serious overcrowding.

4th year. This is our first year of cooking and

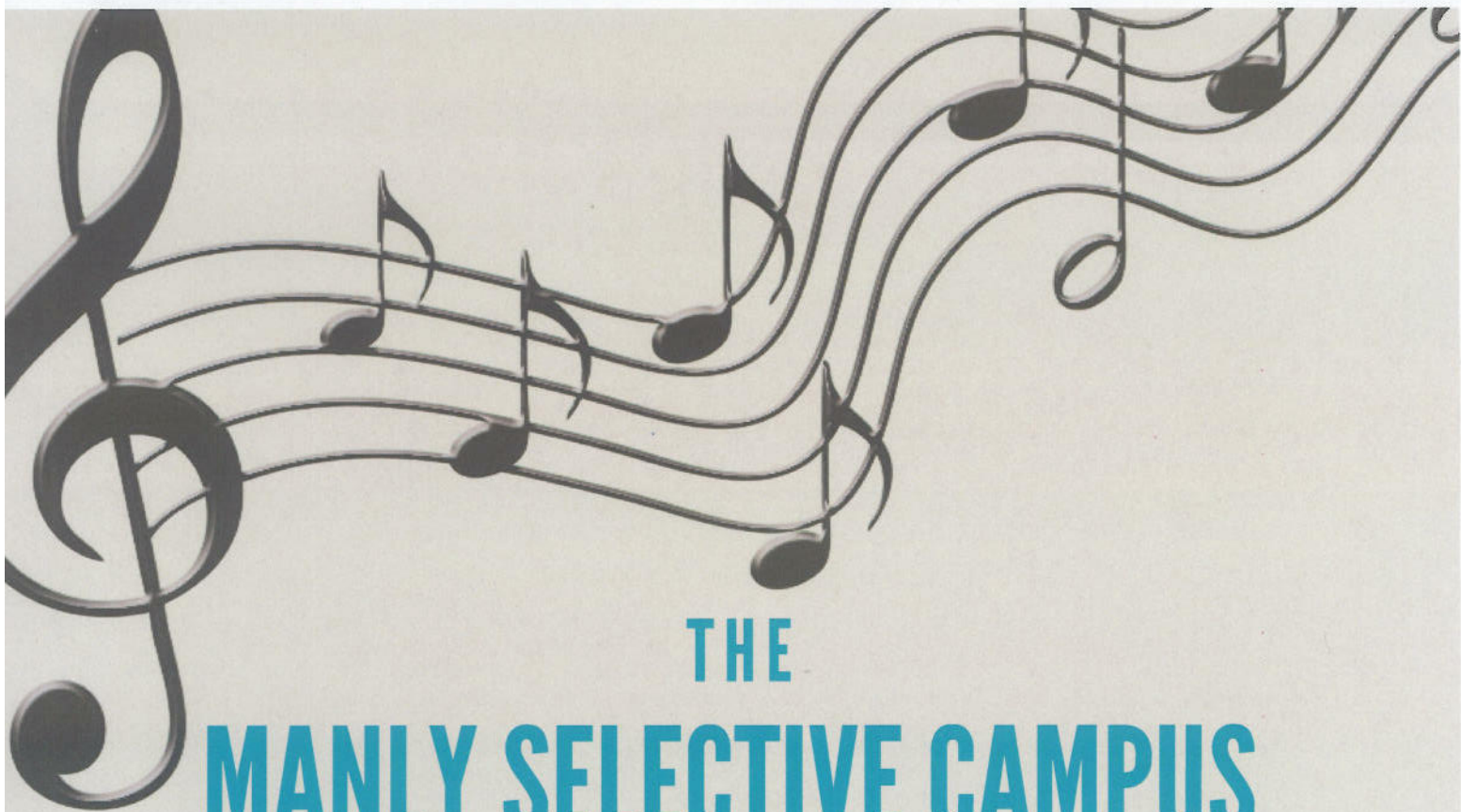
