Last Monday afternoon, the majority of our teaching staff participated in 3 hours of professional learning associated with understanding and meeting requirements for the Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards (BOSTES) teacher accreditation process. While we have a number of teachers who are already working under this 'new' system, all teachers will have to move towards meeting and maintaining accreditation standards in the coming years.

## CHS Boys Football Knockout

On Wednesday, the boys' team travelled to County Road Reserve in Belrose to play against Killarney Heights High School. Both teams were well prepared and knew a tough game was on their hands.

The game started off at a fast pace, with several attacks and counter-attacks by both sides in the opening stanza. Killarney got an early lead with a goal in the 9<sup>th</sup> minute and followed up 10 minutes later with a second one.

2-0 down, the boys continued to push Killarney and an excellent counter-attack was started from our defensive line. Alec Franks won the ball off the opposition deep in our own half, passing up the left wing and with James Regan and Theo Guichon ready to pounce on the ball, Theo put the ball in the back of the net in the 31<sup>st</sup> minute, taking us to half-time trailing 2-1.

The next half started as frantically as the first, with a free kick won by Killarney at the edge of the penalty box early on and putting it into the left corner of the net. Manly kept rallying throughout the half with some more promising runs before eventually, 10 minutes from full time, a free kick was won in our attacking quarter with a foul against Nick Milford. Our captain, Alex Molchanoff stepped up to take the free kick and in that play, a penalty was awarded against Sam Kelly, which Molchy confidently placed into the net.

Trailing by a single goal with 10 minutes to go, the boys upped the ante and were really pushing Killarney, almost scoring an equaliser in the last 2 minutes, before the opposition put another one in with a minute on the clock to close out the match, 4-2. Overall, it was an intense and hard-fought contest that the boys should be proud of.

### What is the Wraps for Love Project?

Manly Selective Campus have been involved over the last decade with the school's wider community all contributing through knitting of squares and sewing of them

together to make blankets that are sent to the Wraps for Love in the city who have sent more

than 400,000 Wraps to people in over 75 countries, including Australia.

Students come to the Library and get wool and needles so that you can knit while you are travelling or just sitting around home.

Knit squares of 50 stitches by 50 rows (make a square) in any colour, using 8 ply synthetic wool and size 4mm or old size 8 needles.  
Donations of wool much appreciated by the 100 students who are busily knitting.

## From the Archives

Every week we will bring you an item from a past issue of the yearly Pines Magazine. This is the final article from 1949 – next week we highlight 1959

### ***Cadet Notes***

*In this, our first year as a full High School, our Company has been sadly handicapped by lack of arms and equipment. Then again, the coal strike made necessary the postponement of our annual camp until December. This did not impair our drill efficiency, as was shown by the guard of honour for the May Youth Rally. Here, our unit, in combination with Christian Brothers' College, was highly praised for its bearing, drill and dress.*

*In the past nine months the company has attended a bivouac, a miniature range day and a field day, all of which were successful.*

*The field day was held at Deep Creek and was attended by about thirty of our cadets under Lt. E Clare, and one hundred and eighty cadets from Riverview and St Aloysius Colleges.*

*The day was a complete success, and all eager participants (most of whom were first year cadets) returned home weary but contented. Another field day is to be held before December, together with a bivouac.*

*All cadets prefer bivouacs to the annual camps, and the popularity of the weekends is largely due to the fact that the emphasis not on drill, but more on range days and lessons, with training films in the evenings.*

*Also in the near future, a miniature range shoot will be held for the Burnett Prize of 10/6. This competition will be handicapped on the results of the last shoot held in July, and the results should prove to be both close and interesting.*

*This year our company of 83 cadets is composed mainly of new blood who, under great difficulties, have maintained their enthusiasm and have kept the company on its feet.*

*The Company was commanded and instructed by two Cadet Officers (Lt E Clare and Lt A Morris) and three Senior NCOs (K Houghton*

*W.O.2, Sgt W Bondfield and Sgt B Sloggett) who all passed out of the Potential Officers and NCO's school in January of this year. Here they found the going tough, learning to take orders that they might be more competently fitted to give them.*

*Most people dislike war, and at this juncture there comes the chance the point that the Cadet Corps does not train boys only for war and to fight for their country should the occasion arise. Indeed, it goes much deeper. Here they are taught discipline, self-control, bearing and many other qualities such as confidence in themselves. This strengthens their characters which they are moulding for themselves during their school careers. While learning drill and other such material things, they are learning comradeship and friendship of a brand which gives a deep sense of pride and honour, forming a dependable base for good citizenship in after-life.*

*And lastly, those who have passed through our detachment's ranks will never forget or regret friendships made. Nor will they regret the discipline and experience gleaned during their membership. In years to come, we hope to have a larger unit, a unit following the highest standards and finest traditions, built by the Company in these, and early years of our Company.*
