## From the Principal

### Year 7 Public Speaking

Year 7 students, under the guidance of staff from Masters Academy, participated in a Public Speaking workshop during the week. Students were given the opportunity to develop skills in understanding what is required for the preparation and delivery of presentations in a range of contexts and how to use voice, expression and body language to best convey that message.

Research indicates that public speaking is one of the life situations that many people find to be most fearsome. These workshops are one way in which we can support students such that these fears, if present, may be overcome. In most courses, students will have to present to their peers and teachers in some form, and if we can support this through the development of skills and techniques it will stand them in good stead as they move into the more senior years of schooling and beyond.



### Years 9 and 10 Debating

Our Year 9 and 10 debating teams continued on their successful ways with wins in debates this week. We are now moving towards the Zone rounds of this competition and very much look forward to having our teams compete at this level.

Congratulations to all students who have represented our school so well and to Ms Renata Kontrec for her ongoing support of our teams.

### Year 9 Project Penguin

For many years now, Project Penguin has been a College based program that our Year 9 students have been involved in. Students from our school mentor primary school students in the development of projects so that local residents become more aware of the plight of local fairy penguin colonies.

It was wonderful to hear from the Deputy Principal from one local primary school praising students from our school for the manner in which they have been mentoring students from his school. This praise was not only directed at the way they supported students through the actual project, but in the manner in which our students encouraged the primary students to work in cooperation with each other and to show respect for each other. Once again, this highlights that learning is not restricted to the content of the course concerned and that the values we instil in students every day are also valuable learning experiences.

### Garvan Institute Visit

Students from Years 11 and 12 gained a valuable insight into a range of career opportunities when they visited the Garvan Institute on Thursday of this week. Both students and their parents have reported back, indicating that this visit was a real 'eye opener' into career possibilities beyond the mainstream of what people consider in selected fields.

### UBS Economics Conference

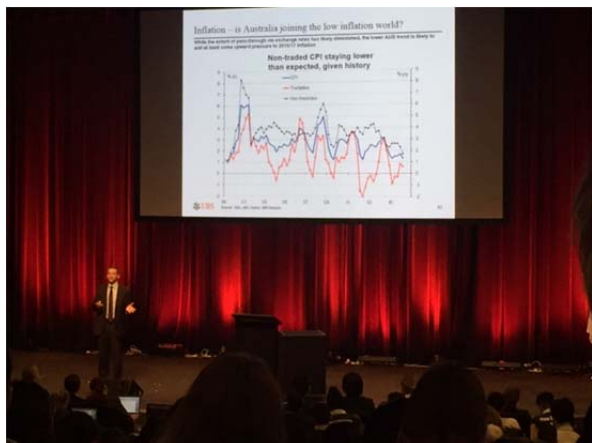
This week, Year 12 Economics students had the opportunity of attending a lecture-style conference from a number of leading economists from UBS and the Reserve Bank of Australia.

The presenters summarised everything from:

- the main changes in this year's federal budget and the impact this will have on a variety of aspects of the economy
- the drivers of growth in the Australian market and the actions the government has taken and can use to address this
- tips on how to apply the theory in the HSC examination

## Canteen News

### Canteen Roster Coordinator Needed

The Canteen Committee is still looking for a volunteer to take over the canteen roster coordinator role in Term 3. We would like to find someone within the current Year 7, 8 or 9 parents, who has some familiarity with the way the canteen and canteen roster works and who is likely to be at the school for the next few years. However this is not a prerequisite – offers from other years are also welcome!

The skills required for the role include: experience with excel spreadsheets and group emails, plus some logical/organisational skills. The main time commitment is at the beginning of the year entering new volunteer details into an excel spreadsheet, arranging the volunteers into the annual roster (also in excel) in consultation with Mel and Brenda, and emailing the draft roster to the volunteers. There is also time at the end of each term when volunteers get the opportunity to request alternative shifts (via email) before the commencement of the new term, requiring some further rearrangement of the roster. Once the term starts volunteers organise their own swaps and Mel manages any day to day changes, so the coordinator's input becomes minimal.
