## From the Principal

### Bands

Congratulations to our bands that competed at the NSW Schools Band Festival last weekend. Of the seven ensembles competing, we came away with five Gold and two Silver Awards. This is a wonderful result and testament to the hard work, skill and dedication shown to our programs by students, our band directors and parents. ### PRAXIS Project

Through the support and planning of Head Teacher Teaching and Learning, Ms Bianca Hewes, selected Year 7 students will begin the second of our cross curricular *PRAXIS* projects next week. Why *PRAXIS*? *PRAXIS* can be defined as “practice, as distinguished from theory”. It is the application and use of knowledge and skills. So, to live this definition, a group of Year 7 students will be withdrawn from regular classes next week and participate in a cross curricular learning task centred on the health of Curl Curl lagoon. Students will be required to respond to a driving question: “What needs to be done so we can rope swing into Curl Curl Lagoon without risking our health?”

Through this project, students will be required to research the history and current health of Curl Curl

lagoon. They will be expected to incorporate content from a variety of subjects areas – Mathematics, Science, Geography - as they work to develop a solution to the problem posed. Following their research, students will create a visual representation of their solution which will be presented to an audience of mathematicians, scientists and representatives from the local council authority.



This is yet another way in which we are providing opportunity for our students to apply the knowledge learned in classes to ‘real world’ experiences and develop contemporary learning skills as they move into the more senior years of schooling. We very much look forward to seeing the results of this project.

### Trial Higher School Certificate

I would like to pass on our very best wishes to Year 12 as they move in to their Trial HSC examinations. These examinations should not only been seen as a component of each student’s HSC assessment, but also as a measure of where they are presently situated in each course and a tool for further improvement prior to the actual HSC examinations in October. Remember, the most important part of these Trial examinations is not the mark you achieve for each, it is the process you go through, the feedback you receive and how you use that feedback for further improvement. This is just another step along that HSC pathway; step with confidence, strive for your personal best and you will achieve academic excellence.

## Building Updates

This week we met with Department of Education, Asset Management Officers and the designers who have been contracted to provide the design documentation for the upgrade to our Library. We have been negotiating a start on this project for a considerable period of time now, and to finally see some 'action' is very heartening indeed. Our school was able to present ideas and concepts about what we would like to see our Library function as and the spaces required to achieve this. Those concepts will now be considered and designs forwarded to the school for consideration.

In addition, progress is being made on the refurbishment of the storeroom under the hall to be converted into a gym. We have done a major clean out of the area, had the lighting upgraded and are now waiting on some plumbing and minor brick work to be done before an awning is built over the entry area and then final painting and fit out. We hope to see this work completed prior to the end of Term 3.

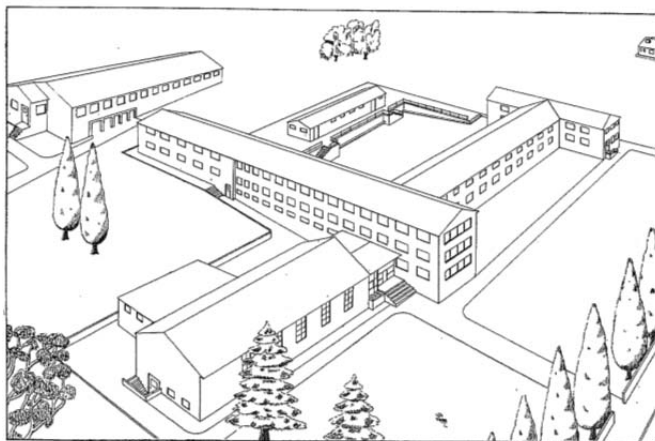

## From the Archives

This week's article is from the 1954 Pines Magazine. The headmaster is Mr W Furnass and the School Captain is Glenn Murcutt, award winning architect, and one of the most glittering alumni of Manly Boys High.

The school has graduated from its temporary home at Balgowlah to its current site.



This is part of the Headmaster's Message from that year ....

*... we have graduated to this modern building with all its internal features so eminently suited for the education of today. Early in the year, in our temporary quarters, there were 1200 pupils and 54 teachers; twelve classes had no classrooms but wandered; two of these could find no accommodation at all but the open air. The weather favoured us.*

*After leaving at Balgowlah the nucleus of what is to be the Balgowlah Boys' High School, more than 900 boys and 46 teachers came into our new building.*

*The effect of the new building upon you has been very evident to me. You are interested in the care of your own desk; you respect the fabric of the building; you are more interested in your personal appearance, knowing that you represent a High School, now taking its place beside the long established High Schools of the City. There is, too, a marked change in your demeanour.*

*Your grounds are being put in order so that you may play tennis, basketball, football or cricket or practise your athletics at morning or luncheon recess, should you wish.*

*We have had our fair share of success in sport in competitions against our fellow schools already; now, in such conditions as there are here, the*

*school, I know, will become noted for the scholastic success of its pupils, too.*

*But, better still, I want you to go forth from school as men and as gentlemen, trying to remove those circumstances which prevent the unembarrassed actions of those around you, putting others at their ease, respecting their opinions, listening to others rather than attempting to dominate them yourselves, guiding and counselling, guarding against unconsidered speech or action, remembering at all times that the word spoken cannot be recalled, and being ever courteous and considerate.*

*Thus accomplished, then do as your school motto suggests, and let others profit by your example: CAPIMUS SED TRADIMUS.*

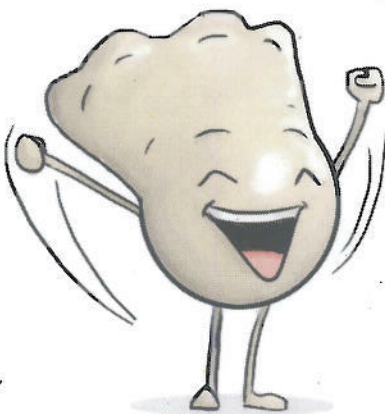
