From the Principal

Yip's Children's Choir

This week we were very fortunate to be able to host a performance of the Yip's Children's Choir from Hong Kong. The choir, founded by Dr. Yip Wai-hong, has been touring internationally for over 30 years. This was a wonderful opportunity for our students to witness the performance of a world class choir and, at the same time, become acquainted with the cultural aspects of some of their performances, including an astounding Mongolian storytelling enactment in traditional costume.



Regional Athletics

At the recent Regional Athletics carnival, Manly Selective Campus students again performed with distinction. Our school finished the carnival in 3rd place overall, an amazing result considering there were 56 schools competing.

a time of 1.04:21 Tessa was named Regional Age Champion for the 17 Girls.

Each of these students, along with many others from our school, have won selection to participate in the NSW CHS Athletics Carnival to be held on 7, 8 and 9 September.

Building Upgrades

Covered Walkway

This has been 'signed off' by the Department of Education Asset Management Unit as meeting the standard of the Department and what was presented as a need by the school. Reports from students and staff after recent periods of rain were that "*it has worked*" and that they are thankful for our new facility. Students and staff are now able to get to the TAS block, bathrooms and bubbler room without getting wet.

Gym

Work is progressing. Mr Blanch has cleaned out the area and is collecting equipment ready for installation. Some of this had been donated by a local Surf Club. Plumbers have been in this week to increase the size of the stormwater waste pipes so that any water getting into the bottom of the stairwell will be taken away more efficiently. We have accepted a quote from a bricklayer to do some minor repairs inside along with some rendering of walls in preparation for painting. We are currently working with the company that installed the walkway to install an awning over the stairwell into the gym to minimise water and leaf litter falling into the stairwell (the pine needles are the main reason the drains become blocked). Hopefully this will all be completed in the next 2-3 weeks.

Then we will be able to paint, have floor covering installed and equipment can then be brought in ready for use. Timeline: Hopefully by the end of this term.

Library Upgrade

In Week 2, school representatives met with Asset Management Officers and a representative of the company contracted to design the layout of our Library. He was given a brief on how we wanted our Library to function, the features required by staff and students and budgetary constraints. The design company will come back to us with concept ideas for further discussion. Eventually, his company will prepare all of the working documentation that we can use to go to building tender through Asset Management Unit.

Year 7 PRAXIS Project

The next Year 7 authentic learning project was on this week. Students have combined their knowledge of Mathematics, Science and Social Sciences in looking into the health of Curl Curl Lagoon and what it would take to be able to safely rope swing into the lagoon. This project was coordinated by Bianca Hewes and had approximately 20 Year 7 students participating. Students will present their ideas, concepts and plans to an audience of staff, students and Northern Beaches Council representatives today.



Enrolments, 2017

We have had a very positive response from parents of students who have been made offers of enrolment into Year 7, 2017. A very large tour group of approximately 30 families participated in a tour of the school on Wednesday to judge as to whether they will accept their offer of placement or not.

Applications have also been accepted for students seeking enrolment into Years 8-11. We are currently working through these and students will be required to sit the Higher Ability Selection Test which will be conducted on Saturday 13 August. Over 160 applications for enrolment were received.

Year 12

The Trial HSC has been proceeding smoothly this week. Immediately after the Trial, many students have HSC examination components due – Major Works, Drama and Dance performances, Oral examinations in Languages, Reports for Society & Culture, Extension 2 English etc. So, for many of

our students, the HSC 'season' has begun and we wish them well.

Mona Vale OC Unit Links

We have further developed links with Mona Vale OC unit. Last week we had a group of students attend the school to support their debating program. Some of our Year 8 debaters went to MVPS for the day and coached, help prepare and then adjudicated a series of debates. This week, the MV students attended our school and participated in lessons at our campus in the areas of Drama, Dance, English and Science.



We have also continued working with the students of Balgowlah Heights Public School with our Year 11 Accelerated Mathematics students supporting the learning of Primary students in the area of Mathematics.



From the Archives

Again, this week, we are looking back to 1954; the school's first year on the current premises. The school's financial balance sheet makes interesting reading'

THE SCHOOL UNION

A number of points should be notes concerning the balance Sheet of 1953. The main source of revenue is, of course, the School Union fee, and there is also a contribution from the P & C and the Ladies' Canteen Trust. By the constitution of the Union, 9/- in each £ of fees is expended on the purchase of text books, 5/- on sports material, 3/- on the Library, and the remaining 3/- is available for a number of necessary items such as the School Magazine and the duplication of examination papers.

A study of the Balance Sheet will reveal that expenditure under the various headings corresponds closely to these proportions. Expenditure of Union funds and management of Union affairs are in the hands of the Union Committee consisting of staff members and pupils representing all school activities under the chairmanship of the Headmaster.
