## From the Archives

Debating has a long and proud history in our school; read this article (written by T. Heaydon, 5A) in the 1954 Pines Magazine to see where it all began.

### DEBATING NOTES

#### HUME BARBOUR "A" TEAM

*The Hume Barbour "A" Team this year scored the highest success ever achieved by a Manly team. We defeated both the other teams in our division, reached the semi-finals, and were only kept from the finals by a narrow and unfortunate defeat by a very strong team.*

*In the first debate of the year we defeated North Sydney High, a formidable team which has won the Cup on several occasions in the past few years. This is the first time we have ever defeated North Sydney boys.*

*Our next debate, against North Sydney Technical High, was another victory.*

*Since we had defeated both the other teams in our division, we qualified for the semi-finals (only four schools in the State reach this stage). We were placed against Sydney High, the holders of the Cup. The subject, "That the aim of our education should be to teach us to value what is useless", was a very obtuse and difficult one and interpretation bothered both sides. However, the result was against us – by a small margin – and the Cup of victory, so speak, had been dashed from our lips.*

*The speakers in this team were John Wilson (leader), Tom Heaydon, Geoffrey Gunter and Peter Sivyver. All showed a marked improvement on last year's performance in the general principles of debating. Our boys have developed a good style, great confidence and clear perception of topics. In particular they were complimented in every debate by the adjudicators on their great teamwork and*



*skilful and thoughtful presentation and division of case.*

*The first real laurel for our High School in the debating field has been gained. Let us hope that, as the banner now passes to others, many boys with talent will realise their duty and join our debating groups. In this way our School may establish its high reputation in yet another field of scholastic endeavour.*

## **Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability**

### **Notification for Parents and Carers**

All Government and non-Government schools across Australia are required to participate annually in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD).

All Australian schools will collect data on their students who are receiving adjustments to meet additional learning and support needs in accordance with their obligations under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and *Disability Standards for Education 2005*. This data will be provided to the Australian Government to assist in the development of a consistent, national picture of the education needs of students with disability.

The data provided to the Australian Government by the NSW Department of Education and Communities is provided in such a way that it cannot be used to identify any individual student or school.

General information about the national data collection can be found on the Australian Government Department of Education and Training website at <http://education.gov.au/factsheets-nationally-consistent-collection-data-school-students-disability>.

### **Privacy Protection**

The NSW Department of Education and Communities follows the requirements of the *Privacy and Personal Information Protection Act 1998* and the *Health Records and Information Privacy Act 2002*. Schools will collect, record, store and use data about individual students in line with these requirements. Data security and protection is a priority and students' personal details will be kept confidential.

Under Clause 52 of the Commonwealth *Australian Education Regulation 2013*, data collected by the NSW Department of Education and Communities for the NCCD must be provided to the Australian Government Department of Education and Training. This includes the number of students at each level of education, the number in each category of disability and the number at each level of adjustment. The information is provided to the Commonwealth as a series of number sets that cannot be used to identify any individual student or school.

The Australian Government Department of Education and Training follows the requirements of the Commonwealth *Privacy Act 1988* when handling any data provided by NSW Department of Education and Communities in connection with the national data collection. A privacy notice has been developed to by the Australian Government to provide students, parents and carers with important privacy information in relation to the data collection.
