It was an incredibly eye opening and valuable experience where I met so many amazing young volunteers and activists, many of which, in only 48 hours, I would call friends. This fantastic program is a partnership between ACYP and the YMCA, both organisations striving to bring the voices of Aussie Youth to government.

I was lucky enough to have the opportunity to speak at Parliament House on Day 2, in the Legislative Assembly room, about global warming and the need for youth involvement with environmental issues. Hearing about so many urgent issues from Nowra to Newtown to North Tablelands, it really fostered and fed my interest in political matters and I am really grateful for this opportunity.

Wraps with Love

Another huge thank you must go to the couple of parents, ex-parents and teachers who sewed these thousand squares into blankets. A truly fantastic effort on their part. At the end of term Year 12 auctioned off 5 blankets to students at assembly. This helps to raise the necessary funds to support the 2018 Wraps with Love initiative.

Where do these 42 blankets go?

When completed the blankets are sent to the Wraps with Love warehouse in Alexandria. They are then distributed globally by over forty nondenominational and non-political aid agencies to those in greatest need. This charity celebrated 25 years in 2017 and during this time have wrapped 382,000 people.

The Wraps with Love activity is a way that Manly students help to give back to their global community. In 2017, there were 130 students registered to knit squares. In addition we had many family members, even from overseas, who



also gave their time.

Once again, they excelled themselves with over 1000 squares going to make up 42 blankets. A huge thank you to all who participated during 2017.
