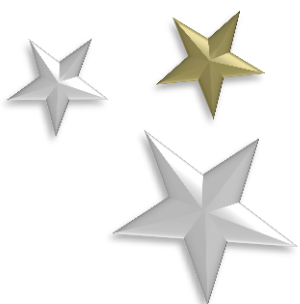
## Year 9 Report

Next year all students will be doing an ILP. The Year 10 Independent Learning Project is an extended self-directed inquiry driven course that provides students with the opportunity to devise a

The projects students devise and complete may be design, art, entrepreneurial, research, subject specific, or a combination of these. The purpose of ILP is to give students freedom over their own learning, whilst developing essential skills for success in senior school, as well as in the real world. These skills include: creativity, critical thinking, self-directed learning, time-management & organisation and reflective thinking. During the holidays it would be a good idea to start giving this a wee bit of thought. The best and most enjoyable ILPs always reflect the passions and interests of the students, so this is where you should start. Some questions to ask yourself might be: *What areas of interest do I search for online if I have spare time? What do I really enjoy doing? What might I like to do in the future? What is it about modern life that needs to change?* So, whilst your holidays are a time to rest and revitalise, they also provide an opportunity to identify an area of interest that will make you ILP an immensely exciting, engaging and rewarding learning experience. So if you are bored at all over the next six weeks, then perhaps give it some thought.....

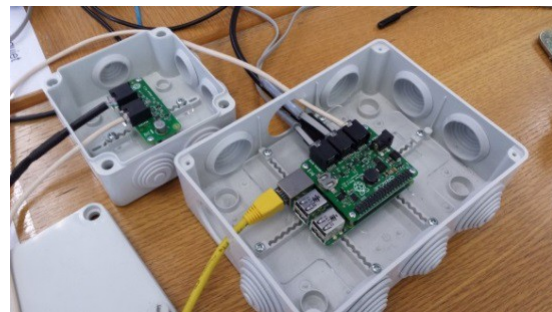


# Raspberry Pi Weather Station

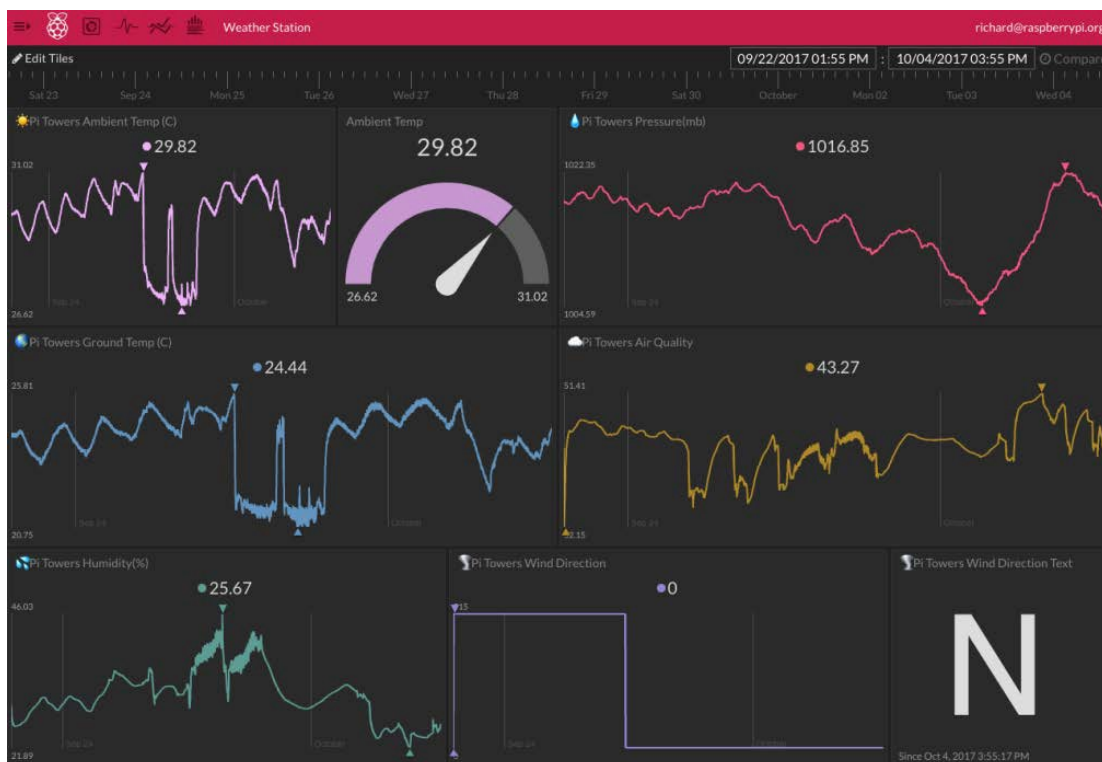


A Raspberry Pi is a small inexpensive credit card sized general-purpose computer with the ability to run multiple programs. The school received a weather station kit from the Raspberry Pi Foundation and a Year-7 group has assembled the project. The weather station will be located near the TAS building. As well as logging data locally, the Pi can log data in a central Oracle database, so students can share information and collaborate with other schools around the world. Once data is collected with the Weather Station, it will be easier to see how the climate is changing and to identify patterns through graphs and visualisations.
