## Attendance

We are currently looking at changing some of our attendance practices and procedures.

Parents will be receiving an SMS early in the morning notifying them of unexplained lateness for students in Years 7-10.

### **Students who need to leave early:**

- All students needing to leave early must have a note, email or phone message from their parent / guardian.
- The student needs to have this notification signed by a Deputy. Ideally this should be done before school.
- Students keep the signed notification with them to show their classroom teacher when they need to leave class.
- Students then go to the Attendance office to receive their early leave slip before leaving the school grounds.

## CHS Boys Football Knockout

On Thursday, the Open Boys CHS Football Knockout was played against Galston High School. 17 boys from Year 8 through to Year 12 faced the tough conditions, with heavy rainfall this week making ground play difficult.

Manly adapted best to the conditions in the opening 10 minutes, with play fixed down in opposition territory, and an early goal in the 4<sup>th</sup> minute courtesy of an attacking raid set up by Chris W with the finishing touch of James R giving us the lead.

The game was played at a fast pace despite the conditions, with both teams making use of the ball and a number of free kicks to Galston were dealt with well by our defensive unit. Galston levelled the scores in the 30<sup>th</sup> minute, making good use of a small opening with a fantastic finish from their striker.

The second half saw both teams lift, with a lot of energy going for the ball and communication getting louder. Galston took the lead mid-way through the second half courtesy of another good finish on the counter. However, Manly hung in there, starting to win more free kicks and having numerous shots sail just wide, a parry by the keeper was well finished by Chris W in the 62<sup>nd</sup> minute.

With the game heading for 30 minutes extra time, in the closing 90 seconds of the game Galston pounced on the attack and again, a clinical finish left Manly no time to come back.

Overall, it was an excellent game played in the right spirit and whilst not walking away with a win, they boys should be proud of their team effort.

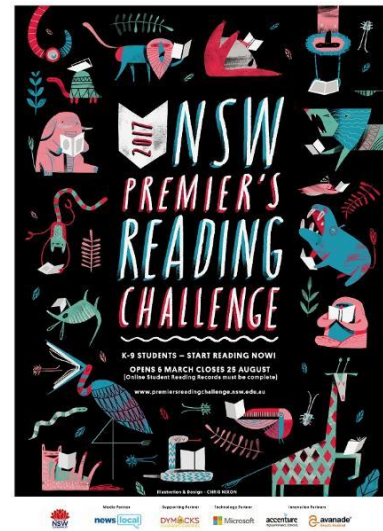

## Library

The 2017 Premier's Reading Challenge is open for all students in Year 7 through to Year 9. Students have to register online (see instructions below) and they fill in their reading log. Students also need to see Mrs Harrison the PRC Co-ordinator in the Library to inform her. They are required to read twenty titles, fifteen from the PRC Years 7 - 9 List plus five of their own choice, by August 20.



The aim behind the Premier's Reading Challenge is for students to read more and to read more widely. Reading helps students to have fun, relax, they are exposed to words and phrases which improves their writing skills, spelling, memory, critical thinking and general knowledge.

At Manly last year two Year 9 Students gained the Premiers' Reading Challenge Medal as they had completed every year since they were in Year 3.

### Changes coming

#### Manly Selective Campus

will transition to the new NSW Public Schools' finance system and a new bank account on **22 May 2017**. To ensure a smooth transition, there will be changes to the way we accept payments from parents and carers.



### *Everything stays the same until 12 May 2017*

#### **Direct deposits (POP – Parent Online Payment):**

As of **12 May 2017**, we will no longer accept direct deposits into our current school bank account as we prepare to close this account and transition to the new one. Any payments made using direct deposit (POP) after this date cannot be properly allocated to a student's account in a timely manner. Please ensure you have made any outstanding direct deposits before **12 May 2017**.

**EFTPOS payments:** We will not be able to accept EFTPOS payments between **17 May and 22 May 2017**. Please ensure that you have made any outstanding EFTPOS payments before **17 May, 2017**. From **23 May 2017**, EFTPOS payments will be accepted as before.

**Cash and cheque payments:** Between **17 May 2017** and **22 May 2017**, we will also not be able to accept payments by cash or cheque as we prepare to close our current bank account and transition to the new one. Please ensure that you have made any outstanding cash or cheque payments before **17 May 2017**. From **23 May 2017**, cash and cheque payments will be accepted as before.

A note from Westpac about your financial privacy: Please note: As a Westpac-hosted solution, cardholder and account details will be held securely helping to protect the school and its customers from fraudulent transactions as well as assisting in meeting the Payment Card Industry Data Security Standard (PCIDSS) compliance requirements.
