Everyone came away from the day wiser and much more informed about driving.

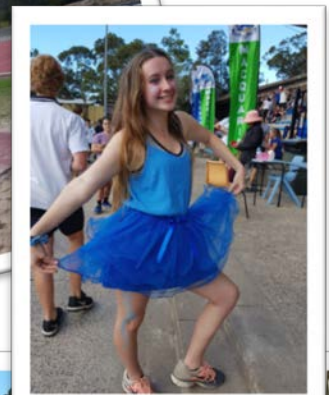
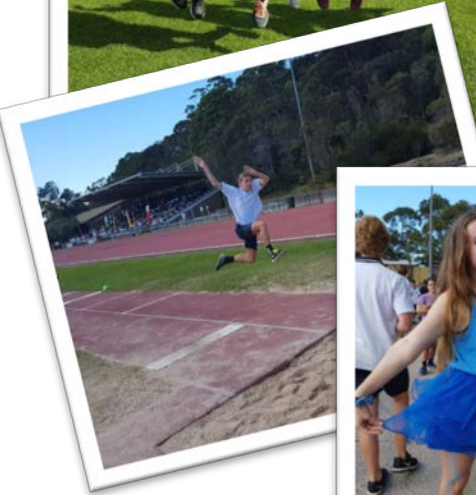
**Be active:** Go for a bushwalk or play a game of sport with your friends. Walk the dog every day. Help around the house by gardening or painting. Go to the gym.

## From the Archives

It is interesting to map technological changes over the decades. As our school is currently in the first planning stages of our library upgrade, read what was red hot twenty years ago. This article appeared in the 1995 issue of The Pines magazine.



### Library News

1995 will be remembered as the year the library joined forces with outside technology – first the computer room – then the world!

During the January vacation, two computers in the library were linked to the new IBM room, allowing student access to the word processing, basic programming and CD ROM programmes such as Encarta, Ancient Lands and Musical Instruments. A special thank you to Mr Lake, vice president of the P&C, who personally supervised the installation. The popularity of this move was evident immediately and the machines have been in constant use. The addition of a printer attached to these library computers made availability of information more accessible and suitable, as students learnt the skill of adapting the source material to suit their needs and to save photocopying money.

The next step towards accessing outside sources of information came via the modem and NEXUS, which provided access to various databases, including Australian Associated Press, CSIRO, etc. This also provided the library with an e-mail address so we can now track down important information sources out there! Now we need a road map to find our way along this information highway.
