From the Principal

NBSC Professional Development Day

Welcome back to Term 3. Staff began the term with College Development Day on Monday, an opportunity for teachers across all five campuses to collaborate and learn together. The focus of day was Visible Learning, based on Professor John Hattie's research into what works best to improve student outcomes. The keynote and workshops provided an engaging overview of the research and also provided teachers with strategies to develop students' metacognitive skills. Our staff were affirmed to hear our teacher professional learning focus on effective feedback to students using strategies, such as 'medals' and 'missions', has a significant positive impact on students' learning.

Interesting also to note, the top two study-skills strategies which have the greatest positive effect on students' learning are 'organising and transforming - making an outline before writing a paper' and 'self-consequences - putting off pleasurable events until work is completed'. Both of these strategies would be worthwhile incorporating into ongoing practice for all students, and in particular for Year 12 working towards their Higher School Certificate with Trial Examinations in Weeks 3 and 4 and Major Works due this term.

Praxis

Year 7 continue to work enthusiastically on their current Praxis project, where they have been challenged to answer the driving question 'How do revolutions progress human knowledge?' Students in Praxis A classes are constructing complex

Rube Goldberg machines that represent the contributions of select revolutions within given disciplines. This project encapsulates our school's commitment to enriching, engaging Project Based Learning experiences to develop students' team work, and critical and creative thinking.

Year 8

On Tuesday I had the pleasure of supervising 21 Year 8 students participate in The Write a Book in a Day competition. In The Write a Book in a Day competition budding authors are given only 12 hours to write, edit, illustrate, review and print a 4,000 - 5,000 word novel suitable for children aged 10 - 16 years. Students are given the parameters at 8:00am; these included two human characters, one non-human character, an issue and the setting. On top of that they were given five random words that they had to include. Completed books are presented to children in hospital. To be eligible to compete teams need to raise a minimum of \$300, with all funds raised going directly to the Kids' Cancer Project. Providing opportunities for students to write for an authentic purpose is a great motivator and embraces our school ethos *Giving Back to the Community*. It was truly inspiring to see the success of so many women in this traditionally male dominated field, and the diverse range of jobs they each held.

On the last day of the program we were lucky enough to gain insight into the different faculties of learning at UNSW and talk to many current students about their experience as a university student studying science or engineering. At the end of the course we presented our discoveries to our fellow students, parents and distinguished guests; including the founder of Science 50:50, Professor Veena Sahajwalla. The whole program was a really incredible and worthwhile experience, and further inspired me to pursue a career in science or engineering. 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From the Archives

Glittering Alumni Our school's rollcall of glittering alumni continues to be impressive year after year. In the 1985 edition of The Pines there is an article that considers the achievements of famous



alumni. Here is an excerpt from the article written by Lisa De Luca, Year 10:

Do you ever wonder about the people who went to Manly High before you? What happened to all those pupils of yesteryear? Well, boys and girls, you may not realise this but we are walking in the footsteps of quite a lot of famous people. How many of you knew that Doug Mulray, the disc jockey on 2MMM was subjected to the same 'Manly torture' doled out to us? I bet David Hay didn't think, as he sat gloomily through a maths period that he would end up in parliament, nor did Chris Puplick – now a Liberal Senator, or Kerry Sibraa, also a politician.

For students, Jock Fraser and Mark Warburton, the days of tyranny had ended as they left in Year 12. Along with Dick Leigh and Allan Hewish, this bunch of schoolboys was let out into the wide world. But they must have liked the place, for as soon as they finished their degrees Manly High was once again to see their happy smiling faces; only this time 'Get outside, son!' was replaced with 'Yes, Sir'. Our beloved teachers must have sat for hours plotting their revenge.

Boys who once ran around the school with shirts hanging out and chewing gum are today the heads of successful businesses such as Peter Ritchie, Managing Director of McDonalds Australia.

With the Sea Eagles being so close, you'd expect to have a cavalcade of football players. Manly High has not disappointed with players like Max Krilich (a captain of Manly and Australia), Terry Randall, Ray Ritchie, Alec Tannant, Roy Bull, Fred Jones, Steve Knight all attended good old Manly Boys. There is also Ken Arthurson, head of the Australian Rugby League. And our school wasn't just known for its Rugby League players – Brian Cox, Tony Miller and Bob Walton were known for their talent in Rugby Union.

Being near the sea Manly had its fair share of famous swimmers and surfers. Maybe your parents will remember people like Dick Ling who represented Australia at the Tokyo Olympics in swimming. Max Riddington won six state surfing titles in the 1950s, and Barry Lumsdane and Dick Twight travelled to South Africa with the Australian Surf Life Saving Team. David Jackman created history by being the first man to conquer the Queenscliff bombora in a 25-foot surf. He, along with Midget Farrelly sat in the same quadrangle, listening to much the same lectures about the same things. One of the great champions of the Open Australian board display titles was Keven Platt (The Wizard) whose parents make the Platt surfwear.

Looking through the school records, a certain R. H. Cutler appeared in the 1937 Pines Magazine. Although he only went to Manly Boys for a short time, this little boy grew up to be Roden Cutler, the Governor of New South Wales.

All these people and many more like them (it is impossible to list them all) have done something positive with their lives. They knew what it is like to be at school, they had to go through the same things as we do and felt the same feelings as you and me. Whether you are very talented or just a trier, give it all your best and you'll know you're a winner
