From the Principal

NESA Critical Thinking Test

Year 11 students took part in trialling the NSW Education Standards Authority Critical Thinking test on Thursday morning. This online test assessed three broad domains of critical thinking – Logical Reasoning, Qualitative Analytical Reasoning and Quantitative Analytical Reasoning, skills indicated by universities and employers as essential for success. We look forward to analysing the students' competencies in these areas when results are available later this term.

Macquarie University Cyber Security Challenge

On Tuesday, a team of five Year 9 students competed in the Macquarie University Cyber Security Challenge. Isaac Clark, Eliza Lee, Justin Luo, Isaac Ng and Amy Rogers finished 4th against 24 teams from other schools, successfully completing four 40-minute challenges involving code breaking, research, problem solving and logic games. With the Australian Crime Commission estimating 'that cybercrime directly costs over \$1 billion annually', this challenge provided our students with an opportunity to engage with the university ambassadors and demonstrate their skills whilst also learning about the impact cybercrime has on our society.



NSW Band Festival

A huge congratulations to everyone involved in the outstanding results achieved by the Bands of Manly Campus at the NSW Band Festival held last weekend at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music. All seven wind and jazz bands who performed achieved the exceptional result of a GOLD award, with adjudicators describing their performances as 'sparkling' and 'beautiful'. 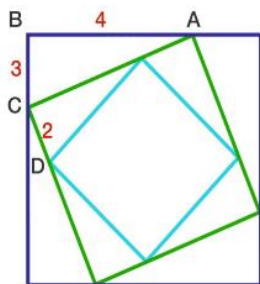
Debating

NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. Planning has begun to move NAPLAN from a pen and paper assessment to an online assessment. A fact sheet has been sent home to Year 7 and 9 parents and carers to help understand the transition process, which includes a NAPLAN Online School Readiness Test to be held between 14 August and 22 September this year. Students currently in Year 7 and 9 will participate in the NAPLAN Online School Readiness test in Week 7. Information will be circulated to these students closer to the date. Students in Year 8 will receive information at the Year 8 into 9 Subject Selection Evening.

Year 8

I am pleased to announce that NBSC Manly Campus raised just over \$2000 for the Kids' Cancer Project as part of the Write a Book in a Day competition. Just over \$1000 was raised from individual team sponsorships and just over \$1000 was raised from the Mufti Day and Bake Sale on Tuesday. Students should be confident that their thorough preparation will stand them in good stead to achieve their personal best in these examinations.

Next Monday, Year 7 have an exciting day planned for their Gala Day where they will participate in a round robin tournament in one of basketball, football, netball and touch. Each team will be coached and managed by a selection of Year 10 students, allowing them to not only enjoy a fun day out with their peers but also develop closer ties with some of the older students of the school.

Year 9 students had the opportunity this week to attend wellbeing workshops run by external providers. Both these programs allow our students to develop a better awareness of themselves and support those around them as they progress through their teenage years into adulthood.

Cyber Bullying

On the 25 July, Macquarie University held a Cyber Security Challenge in which we participated. From 8:30am to 3pm, a team of five students from Manly travelled to the university to compete in four challenges based on logic and cyber skills. The day was better than expected, with code breaking, problem solving, games, juice box selfies, and, last but not least, a highly satisfactory brownie we had for recess.

The four challenges were each for a duration of forty minutes, which we considered both too long and not long enough depending on the specific challenges.

The first challenge was perhaps the most difficult challenge of the day, as we encountered first-hand the trouble of when ctrl c and ctrl v didn't work; a factor which the creator of the challenges claimed was intentional. The ancient program forced users to improvise and think of solutions to problems we would not normally incur. Our first idea was probably the worst, as we tried to write 100 digit integers, figure by figure. This was very tedious, and wasted time we could have used in the second segment of the challenge, which we were unable to complete, bar a very lucky guess.

Challenge 2 was a research and problem solving task involving Caesar codes, hasty google searches

and a desperate hunt around Macquarie Uni for the signature of an IT agent.

The third challenge was a logic game, involving crates, glowing green dots, (infuriatingly placed) brick walls, and a little man on a pile driver. It was safe to say that this was one of the most frustrating challenges. The tension in the room, upbeat (but surprisingly good) music, and the equal ruthlessness of the rival teams certainly succeeded in increasing the exasperation felt by all five in the team when we realised we had to start the level over again.

Challenge 4r was composed of symmetric key codes that our team was forced to unravel. As this was the last challenge our team was to compete in, it seemed more competitive than the previous three. We managed to solve it first, and we all discovered from the solution that the tamanoir was indeed an anteater from South America. This challenge involved binary code, Rjandeal-256 and hexadecimals which we had to decode on a dodgy internet program.

Our team finished 4th against 24 other competing teams but we all felt gutted that we hadn't made the podium. We suffered close losses to Turramurra, which cost us a third placing. Despite the endless frustration and overworked brain cells, the day was very rewarding (not just in the brownie regard) and would be a challenge we would not hesitate to compete in again.

Update: Important UAC information to Year 12 students

UAC applications open Wednesday, 2 August 2017. Year 12 students will receive an email with their four-digit UAC PIN on Monday 31 July 2017. UAC will use the email addresses listed with the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) to send students their PIN. It is important that students have provided a current email address to NESA. Students will need their UAC PIN and Year 12 student number to apply for tertiary study through UAC. Once students have entered their contact details into their online application, they will receive a UAC Application Number. They will need this number and their UAC PIN to make changes to their application and access their offers. Students will also need their UAC PIN to access their ATAR later in the year. It is important that students keep their PIN in a secure place.

Changes for 2018 admissions

There are important changes to UAC 2018 Admissions. The maximum number of preferences will now be five. There will be an offer round after ATAR release and before Christmas. There will be an offer round in mid-January but no 'Main Round'. SRS offers will be made in November. Cut-offs are published for the pre-Christmas round and the mid-January round.

Proof of citizenship

In the new admissions period, UAC will be asking applicants to provide proof of citizenship. This is entirely optional, and not submitting proof of citizenship will not affect an applicant's chances of receiving an offer. Applicants who do not provide proof of citizenship when applying will need to provide it to enrol at university.

Changes to processing charges

'On-time applications' are now referred to as 'early bird applications'. The processing charge for early bird applications is \$58 for domestic Year 12. The early bird period spans from Wednesday 2 August 2017 to midnight on Friday 29 September 2017. All applications received from 30 September 2017 will incur a standard processing charge of \$183 for domestic Year 12 students.

AITSL requirements for teaching courses

The Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership (AITSL) has set an expectation of

universities to select entrants into initial teacher education courses who have the academic capabilities and personal qualities that will enable them to successfully graduate as classroom-ready teachers. Australian universities have responded to this in different ways. Some are using online assessment tools such as CASPer, a Canadian test. Others have integrated a personal statement as a requirement of their admission process for teaching courses. Students who have applied for a teaching course at one of the following institutions will need to submit a personal statement addressing their motivation and suitability for teaching: Australian Catholic University, CQUniversity, University of New England, University of Sydney and University of Wollongong. The one personal statement is valid for all teaching preferences to the above institutions.

Schools Recommendation Schemes

Schools Recommendation Schemes (SRS) are one way institutions make early offers of undergraduate admission to current Australian Year 12 students, using criteria other than (or in addition to) the ATAR. SRS applications open on Wednesday 2 August 2017 and close at midnight on Friday 29 September 2017. After this date, students cannot access or modify their SRS application. There are two types of offers available under SRS. Successful applicants may receive a conditional offer (where there are additional criteria to meet, such as a minimum ATAR, portfolio or audition) or an unconditional offer (where there are no further requirements to meet). SRS applicants must have any courses they would like to be considered for an SRS offer included in their list of preferences by midnight on Sunday 12 November 2017. SRS unconditional and conditional offers will be released on Thursday 16 November 2017.

Educational Access Schemes

Educational Access Schemes (EAS) aim to help students whose education has been negatively affected during Year 11 and/or Year 12 receive an offer to university. Institutions use EAS to help eligible applicants gain admission to university if their ATAR is below a course cut-off by allocating bonus points, or places, to eligible EAS applicants. EAS applications open on Wednesday 2 August 2017. If students apply by 30 November 2017, UAC will send them an eligibility letter on 12 December 2017. The letter will list EAS eligibility for all institutions. UAC applies a standard assessment procedure for all applicants, regardless of course

preferences, however some institutions have EAS policies which may prevent some applicants from being eligible for EAS consideration at that institution. These policies cover previous tertiary study, course exclusions, minimum ATAR requirements, school exclusions and minimum EAS thresholds. For more information, read the *EAS Eligibility Letter and Institution Policies* fact sheet available on the [UAC website](#) from Wednesday 2 August 2017. The *Educational Access Schemes (EAS) 2017–18* booklet, which includes an application form, will be delivered to schools at the end of July/early August. The booklet, application form and supplementary application form will be available to students from Wednesday 2 August 2017.

Equity Scholarships

Equity Scholarships (ES) assist financially disadvantaged students with the costs associated with higher education. Students apply online for an Equity Scholarship through UAC. ES applications open on Wednesday 2 August 2017. A list of key dates will be available on UAC's website and on the inside cover of the *Equity Scholarships 2017–18* booklet, which will be delivered to schools at the end of July/early August. It will also be available to students on UAC's website from Wednesday 2 August 2017. The most important scholarship offer rounds for Year 12 students are on Friday 22 December 2017 and Monday 15 January 2018. These rounds are when most Year 12 applicants receive their ES offers. Further ES offer rounds are available throughout 2018.

We are excited to announce that online ordering is now available for lunches at the canteen. We have partnered with Flexischools, so some families may already have an account setup from siblings at other schools, or from your child's primary school days. You can topup your account for free by direct bank transfer. Topups by Visa, Mastercard or PayPal incur a charge of 15 cents + 1% of value. There is a fee of 29 cents per order.

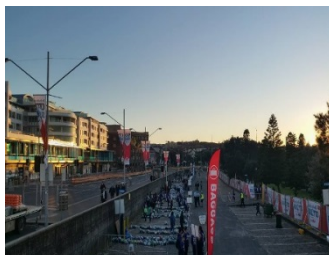




CALL OUT TO MSC STUDENTS and FAMILIES!
