Our Year 11 students have been involved in RYDA and GP Visits in Schools during the past week as part of their Crossroads program. RYDA is a powerful workshop that challenges 'students to change the way they think about road safety and lay the foundation for safe road use throughout their lives'. Some memorable facts mentioned by students included the 3 second rule about the safe space between cars whilst driving, the difference in stopping distances at different speeds and the significant change in peripheral vision caused by talking on your phone while driving. Ongoing partnerships

Manly Campus has a long-standing partnership with *Bushlink* - an organisation dedicated to

creating real and valued employment for people with disabilities. Working



together with Year 8 students, the team from *Bushlink* use their specialist environmental skills to transform specific areas of the school grounds. This can include weeding, pruning, clearing, mulching and planting in bushland. There are many benefits to this program including knowledge transfer, student pride and ownership, spirit of inclusion and creating memorable and enjoyable experiences for our students and the team from *Bushlink*. We express our thanks to Year 8 for the work they do giving back to our own community.

Annual events

The Write a Book in a Day competition is another example how our students are giving back to the community. Budding authors are given only 12 hours to write, edit, illustrate, review and print a 4,000 - 5,000 word novel suitable for children aged 10 - 16 years. Completed books are presented to children in hospital. To be eligible to compete teams need to raise a minimum of \$300, with all funds raised going directly to the Kids' Cancer Project. Providing opportunities for

students to write for an authentic



purpose is a great motivator and embraces our school ethos *Giving Back to the Community*.

Student driven initiatives

With my position as a student ambassador for Oaktree, I introduced the 'Live Below the Line' initiative to our school for the first time this year. This campaign aims to attack the issue of poverty and attempts to support programs and initiatives where all of our



fundraising efforts will go to help crisis' overseas. It is a really important issue that we don't often see in Australia, but is incredibly significant in others' lifestyles, so it is really good to see students getting behind this cause.

'Live Below the Line' involves participants to live off of \$2 a day for 2 or 5 days, and receiving donations from friends and family for their participation and support of the campaign. I originally had set our school's fundraising target at \$500, but we absolutely smashed that and have managed to fundraise \$1061. This is such an amazing achievement and I'm so proud to have been able to have such success in its first year of running the campaign at our school.

I would like to thank everyone who donated to our team and for the support of the staff and students in my organisation and event planning. I'm really hoping to see this event run in future years, and I believe addressing the issue of poverty is extremely important for us to collectively learn how to feel grateful for what we have, and to support those who need it most.





The Engineering & Technology Cadetships (ETCAD) program was launched in 2013 by Professional Cadetships Australia (PCA), an Australian company that has a proven record of placing Year 12 students with leading companies. Under previous ETCAD Programs, PCA has placed Engineering Cadets at Rolls-Royce and Technology Cadets at Macquarie Group and Westpac.

The 2018 ETCAD Program

Engineering Cadets

- Study engineering full-time and work at Cubic during university vacations in the middle of the year and over summer

Technology Cadets

- Work for Macquarie Group in Sydney for the duration of their degree
- Undertake university study in computer science, information technology or information systems. Alternatively, cadets may undertake a commerce or arts degree and select information systems as one of their majors
- In first year, Technology Cadets study full-time in Semester 1 and work full-time in the second half of the year. From second year onwards, cadets will typically study and work throughout the year

Applications close Friday 22 June 2018

To be considered for a Cadetship under the ETCAD Program, you will need to expect an ATAR of at least 86.25






CALL OUT to Manly Campus students and families!
