


Bands of Manly Success

MSC Colour Run

The Manly Campus Colour Run promotes healthy and active lifestyles while helping raise funds for our School and for the wider community! It's all about participation, with students treated to a great day as a reward for their fundraising efforts. Family support is key to our fundraising success and we encourage everyone to get involved.

This year we have changed our fundraising from the online system to a \$20 entry fee. The reason for this being that with the online system, we lose 20% of our profit to pay for the student prizes. As a school (and from feedback from parents), we have decided to step away from the prizes this year, and donate the 20% to those in greater need – Our Australian Farmers. With 100% of NSW currently affected by drought, we want to do our bit to help out.

The \$20 entry fee includes admission into the Colour Run, a sausage sandwich and an afternoon full of entertainment. We are seeking the generosity of our community to donate what they can to this cause. All money made will go directly into our Outdoor Fitness Equipment and to our Farmers in need. Students will be encouraged to ask their community (family, friends, neighbours) for additional donations and to submit this through our school POP system.

Students must return their permission notes if they are participating in the Colour Run. An alternate activity will be organised for students who opt out of the colour run.
