After School Library

Debating

Following on from our 2018 debating successes, Masters Academy will once again be providing debating and public speaking training for our students. The Masters Academy debating program will give students the opportunity to join over 1,200 other students from more than 20 schools across the state currently participating in debating and public speaking programs. Classes are held before school from 8am on Tuesdays and are streamed by year group.

Masters is now officially registered as a Creative Kids Supplier, which entitles parents to a \$100 rebate for their communications clubs or courses. Special Religious Education / Alternative Program for Non-Participants

Special Religious Education (SRE) is an integral part of the curriculum in government schools. Representatives of approved religious persuasions have an opportunity to provide SRE in every government school in NSW. When you enrol your child you may, if you wish, nominate an SRE class for your child to attend. Your child will then be placed in the nominated class. At any time you can ask for your child to be transferred to a different SRE class or be allocated to a non-scripture group.

The content of SRE classes is specific to each religion or denomination. It is not the same as General Religious Education, which is a component of the Human Society and its Environment key learning area. General Religious Education involves learning about religions, the place of religion in society and the importance of religious beliefs for particular individuals and communities.

Each school term, one year group from Years 7-10 is allocated 7/8 periods of scripture, one per week, usually on a Monday. In 2019 the scripture providers are Mr Paul Searle and Mr Nick Meakes, teaching the Protestant scripture program and Mr Peter Barwell teaching the Catholic scripture program. Teachers who provide SRE are authorised by their religious persuasion and many of them have completed special training. As the teachers and the materials they use are authorised by the religious persuasions, not by the school, any concerns or questions about the content of the SRE classes go to the scripture teacher. If your question or concern is not addressed through this process please raise the matter with the school Scripture Coordinator Mrs Deb Rixon (HT Wellbeing).

Students who do not attend scripture are assigned a non-scripture group, in which they do private study supervised by teachers. During these lessons students are required to have meaningful school related tasks to complete.

From the Deputies

Tuesday was Safer Internet Day (SID). This is an annual event around the world with the aim to encourage safer internet use. This year's theme—'Together for a better internet' encourages individuals to create a better internet by critical skills required for navigating the online world. We call them the 4Rs:

Respect - I treat myself and others the way I like to be treated

Responsibility - I am accountable for my actions and I take a stand when I feel something is wrong

Reasoning - I question what is real **Resilience** - I get back up from tough situations



Parents are encouraged to get involved and support our young people in developing the critical skills required to successfully navigate the online world. The online world can be unpredictable for young people and difficult to navigate. Building critical skills in young people can help them manage relationships and respect differences. While it can take time and practice to identify and develop the range of skills that help us act with respect, we need to make it a regular practice to appreciate diverse perspectives, communicate with empathy, negotiate with people who are different to us and develop leadership skills. These skills take time to develop but they can help us in all areas of life – online and off.

Help spread the word about creating a safer, more positive internet — start a conversation with your child about which of the 4Rs of online safety is most important to them and how can they help build a better internet for everyone.

The <u>eSafety iParent site</u> is packed with resources to help you address online safety with your children. For Download, <u>The Lost Summer</u> video game (11 – 14 years) is a fun way to learn and practice the 4Rs. Or take the <u>Screen Smart Parent Tour</u> to help your child manage online issues should they arise.

Save the date: On Monday 25 March we will be hosting a 'Digital Nutrition' parent seminar presented by registered psychologist Jocelyn Brewer. The presentation will provide up-to-theminute trends on young people, technology & current research. 
