#### **Local Sporting Champions Grant**

The Local Sporting Champions grant provides financial assistance for coaches, officials and competitors aged 12-18 participating in state, national or international championships.

Children can represent their sporting club or their school in these sporting events.

If successful, individual applicants will receive \$500-\$750 towards the cost of attending their championships, covering travel, accommodation, entry fees, uniforms, equipment and other travel expenses. This grant is given out every three months - the usual deadlines are June 30, September 30, December 31 and March 31 each year.

Parents & children need to apply directly via a simple online application form.

This is a fantastic grant that is 'electorate based', meaning each electorate is given a certain number of grants to award. This number is a reflection of the number of eligible applications received. So we would like to encourage all eligible kids in Warringah to apply.

In our first year (June 2019-March 2020), Zali's electoral office gave out 71 LSC grants to local juniors, covering 26 sports, equalling \$42, 000. To see if juniors from your sport have received this grant, please <u>CLICK HERE</u>.
