COVID-19 update

As we headed into the holidays, we were all full of expectations that things would be somewhat 'back to the new normal' this term. Unfortunately, with the increase in locally transmitted cases of COVID-19 in Victoria and now in NSW, there has been no further easing of restrictions in our schools. While we are delighted that extra-curricular activities, including band, vocal ensemble and dance are back on, there is still much that does not resemble our typical schooling experiences. It is with much sadness that we had had to continue to modify or cancel events and activities this term. All precautions must still be taken to ensure the safety of everyone. As a further measure this term, parents and other visitors are only allowed onto the school site if they have an appointment. This is necessary so meeting rooms can be prepared and surfaces cleaned to assist adults, including staff to adhere to social distancing requirements. I apologise for any inconvenience this may cause. 
Trial HSC Examinations
