## From the Principal

#### **HSC Drama**

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#### Year 10 into 11 interviews

Year 10 into 11 interviews, conducted throughout the week, have provided a valuable opportunity for students and parents to discuss Stage 6 subject choices and potential career and study options. Strategies to support students through a range of study techniques and wellbeing initiatives, were also discussed. Many thanks to Mr Crooks, Mr Newcomb and Ms Rixon who conducted the interviews.

#### **Debating**

Covid-19 put a temporary halt to inter-school debating competitions during Term 1 and 2. So it is wonderful to see the competition finally back and in a Covid-safe, online format, so our debaters can still participate in this challenging and rewarding extracurricular area. The Year 9, 10 and 11 debating teams have won their first debates in the Round 1 of a Knockout competition of the Premier's Debating Challenge. Year 9 and 10 argued successfully that classes at school should be organised by ability instead of age. Year 9 came up against Pittwater High School while Year 10 debated Mosman High School.



Year 11 came up against North Sydney Girls and produced a success argument against the implementation of compulsory meditation and mindfulness classes in school, suggesting instead that schools should develop "mental health hubs" to cater for students' wellbeing needs. It was a thrill for the experienced Year 11 team to have Ms O'Sullivan in the audience for their debate, as all teams have missed face-to-face interaction.



The teams' next debates in Round 2 are against Hornsby Girls High School (Year 9) and Ryde Secondary College (Year 10) while the next round for Year 11 will be against North Sydney Boys.

Meanwhile, Trials have been held for the Year 7 and 8 representative teams. Manly's senior debating students judged the tryouts, and commented that the quality of Manly's youngest students was very high. The teams will debate NBSC Mackellar Girls Campus and Killarney Heights High School later this term.

#### **COVID-19 Test Fast Tracked for Year 12 Students**



Year 12 students will now have their COVID-19 test result fast-tracked through pathology. They simply need to advise the nurse or doctor doing the test that they are HSC students.

Results will be fast-tracked to reduce disruption to their studies and exams. We also want to reduce potential anxiety around getting tested and ensure students self-isolate at home until their results are known. This will help protect the whole community.

It is important that all Year 12 students:

- Stay 1.5m apart where possible
- Wear a mask if physical distancing isn't possible when they are out and in the broader community
- Get tested ASAP if they have even the mildest of symptoms
- Tell the clinician doing the test they are a Year
   12 student and to mark the referral 'Urgent HSC student'
- Stay home and self-isolate until results are known
- Receive a negative test result before returning to school; showing the school a screenshot of an SMS result is sufficient
- Call the contact number provided by the clinic if results are not received within 36 hours.

#### **Gifted Parenting Series**

It is common for parents of gifted children to feel confused about the educational needs of their child. Sometimes, the advanced development of the abilities of a gifted child outpaces the child's physical development, and results in frustration for both parent and child. Additionally, challenges exist for parents in understanding the affective needs of gifted children, which may be very different to the rest of the population.

We hope that this eight-part series will assist parents to develop a greater understanding of their gifted child's needs both at home and at school; interact with other parents of gifted children; and learn from current research and experts in the field of gifted education.

The series is delivered online (via Zoom), 7pm - 8:30pm Tuesday and Thursday nights, during September, and is led by GERRIC academics: Associate Professor Dr. Jae Yup Jung, Dr Geraldine Townend, and Dr. Peta Hay.

## Year 10 Geography Incursion

Instead of the usual Narrabeen/Collaroy excursion, which has been a rite of passage for all Year 10 students in the past, we were fortunate enough to have Toni, Tim and Tristan from the Coastal Environment Centre come to Manly Campus. They shared with the students, some of the geographical issues that face the Northern Beaches; water pollution in Curl Curl Lagoon and coastal erosion along Collaroy and Narrabeen Beaches.

There was a talk about coastal erosion in Collaroy/Narrabeen, where we traced back the events in June 2016 that led to massive coastal erosion, considered how the council and residents are working together to build a seawall to protect homes along the coast, and whether there is a better option to protect the beaches into the future.

Students had the opportunity to simulate how different management strategies could protect homes from coastal erosion in repurposed baby cribs (sea walls seemed to be the best options)

We also conducted tests on water from Curl Curl Lagoon, (FYI this still isn't safe to drink from) and considered how the local environment contributes to the water pollution.

A big thank you to Toni, Tim and Tristan who made the incursion a very valuable experience.

#### **3D Printer Filament Recycling Update**

Last week, the 3Devo 3D filament recycling hardware arrived at Manly Campus. This was enthusiastically unboxed by Ms Farrow's Year 12 Design and Technology class, then under the watchful eye of Year 12 student Yiming Teng, we successful extruded our first roll of filament ready for testing with our 3D printers. This recycled roll of filament represents 500 grams of plastic saved from becoming landfill and a \$50 saving to the school's consumable materials budget. A small group of Year 10 students have begun sorting our stockpile of failed prints and support material in preparation for recycling.



Top to bottom: Year 12 Design and Technology unboxing the 3Devo (having a small break from completing their Major design projects), partly assembled, with students and Ms Farrow






Top to bottom: Yiming assembling the recycler, Fully assembled recycler, filament shredder loaded with material ready for shredding, first roll of recycled filament being produced.

The school is supportive, as we all feel that with so many challenges and cancellations of their activities this year, it is essential for students' mental well-being, as well as musicality, to be able to participate in their interests and passions as much as possible.

This week, we introduced more changes to adhere to the restrictions of "No blowing and no mixed year groups" for the rest of Term 3.

This involves students learning new skills, broadening their musical knowledge and most of all having fun. They will work on rhythm, percussion, repertoire, aural and listening skills and will still be doing their home exercises in order to be ready to play together again next term (hopefully).

Students will be playing only in their year groups.

Strings will still be able to play their usual instruments but it will be split across 2 days so there are not so many groups going at once (each year group needs to be in its own room).

Unfortunately, Chamber, Jazz Combo, Junior Jazz Combo and Covers will not be able to continue for the rest of term due to them being smaller bands and involving many year groups. Liz will instead be taking the senior strings on Mondays.

Every student should bring something with them to rehearsals - drum sticks if you have them, or chopsticks, wooden spoons etc, we are very interested to see what turns up. If a student plays rhythm already i.e. guitar, bass, drums, piano, they will be playing those as well and should bring their instrument as usual.
