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From the Principal

Return to school

It is terrific having the whole school back together again after 63 school days of learning from home. Seeing our students fill classrooms, engaged in their learning, excited and happy to be together is wonderful. On return to face-to-face learning, we made a conscious decision to ensure not to bombard students with tasks to 'catch up on what they had missed'. Whilst we have still maintained our obligation to focus on our core business of teaching and learning, it has been really important to focus on re-establishing 'normality' and the wellbeing of our entire school community. While we operate under Level 3 Plus restrictions, we will continue with staggered finish times. Students in Year 7 - 9 finish at 3:10pm and students in Year 10 and 11 finish at 3:20pm.

Information about close contacts, self-isolating and COVID-19 cases at school

The department has updated its <u>response</u> <u>protocols for COVID-19 cases</u>, with detailed guidance for parents and carers about what will happen should there be a confirmed case of COVID-19 at school and students are identified as a close or casual contact. NSW Health will notify the school if there is a positive COVID-19 case who has been infectious while at school and we will in turn notify parents and carers. Contact tracing will be undertaken as it is in all other venues. The action we take in relation to the operation of the school will depend on how many people the person has been in contact with. In some cases, this may mean that the school may need to be made temporarily non-operational. Some staff and students may be asked to self-isolate as a precaution while contact tracing is completed. A reminder that anyone who has the mildest of COVID-19 symptoms must not attend school and must get tested immediately and self-isolate until they get a negative result - even if they are vaccinated.

Engineering Update

During Term 3 Year 10 Industrial Technology -Engineering (ITE) students completed an alternative to fossil fuels energy research task and have applied their new-found knowledge of solar panels and power generation in a practical way with the construction of a project incorporating a solar panel. After many weeks out of the workshop during online learning, Year 10 ITE are making excellent progress assembling their Arduino controlled Solar Tracker projects. This project works by using four light dependent resistors and two servo motors to move the solar panel so it follows the suns path to generate the largest amount of electricity possible. Their work is based on a project by a STEM company called Brown Dog Gadgets. Congratulations to Riddhish, for being the first student to complete the construction and testing of his Solar Tracker.
