From the Principal

Update on proposed bell times for 2022

Thank you to all parents, students and staff who have had an input into the proposed change to the structure of the school day by attending the information sessions, completing the surveys, posting and emailing through questions or comments and meeting with me. As previously communicated, here is a summary of the results:

Do you support the proposal?

- Parents and carers more than 50% of parents completed the survey and 81% indicated that they are in support of this proposal.
- Students 50% of students completed the survey and 87% indicated that they are in support of this proposal.
- Staff all staff completed the survey and 78% indicated that they were in support of this proposal.

Does your child require supervision on Monday and Friday afternoons from 2:30pm – 3:25pm?

 Approximately 50% of parents completed the survey and 79% said that they do not require supervision from 2:30pm – 2:35pm on Monday and Friday afternoons.

Based on your input through the consultation process, we have changed the original proposal and adjusted the lessons to 55 minutes. Lessons on Monday and Fridays will increase from 53 minutes to 55 minutes. Lessons on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday will reduce from 60 minutes to 55

minutes. We are negotiating with the new transport company and have requested that the afternoon bus services are changed to accommodate the proposed changes. This week, the bus company conducted an on-site headcount for all school buses to understand what changes and resources will be needed to accommodate the school bell time change. Next week, I will be meeting with the bus company to go over the data and discuss possibilities. However, if this is not possible, teacher supervision will be provided in the library on Monday and Friday afternoons, 2:30pm – 3:25pm.

School ventilation program

The NSW Government recently announced a \$100 million air quality assurance program to provide permanent air quality improvements to schools across NSW. The program has several components, including installing automatic fresh air ventilation systems in smaller learning spaces to allow schools to utilise the areas fully. We are part of the first tranche to receive fresh air ventilation systems as part of this program. The fresh air ventilation systems will replace the temporary air purifiers that are already in place in the school. These are permanent systems that will supplement natural ventilation and ensure spaces can continue to be occupied safely.

NBSC Medicine Information Evening 2021

On Wednesday, 24 November, Manly Campus hosted the Medicine Information Evening, via zoom, for NBSC students from Year 10-12, interested in pursuing a career in Medicine. Seven current medical students, many of whom are Manly Campus alumnus, expertly represented UNSW, Newcastle, Western Sydney, Queensland and Sydney University.

The students provided valuable insights into their experiences at each medical school, and also shared expert advice on how to ace the UCAT/GAMSAT exams and medical interviews, as well as simultaneously juggle their HSC. They all agreed that there are so many different pathways into medicine and emphasised that students ought

not to be discouraged if they are unsuccessful on their first or second attempt. They also spoke about the imposter syndrome they all initially felt, but stressed that medicine is very achievable, and that the admission process is so difficult due to the

popularity of the course.

On behalf of the Manly Campus, Mr Ben Mills (P&C) and Mr Forsyth (TAS HT) researched and developed a grant application in May this year to purchase a Plasma cutting table. Last week we were officially notified that our grant application was successful by Mr James Griffin MP, Member for Manly. Weldclass CNC plasma will be providing the equipment with new stock arriving in February next year.

The plan, pending Asset Management Unit (AMU) approval, will be to locate the equipment in an upgraded storeroom under the TAS block. Once the TAS staff have installed and become proficient with this equipment, access will be provided for Manly Campus students especially Year 9 and 10 Industrial Technology - Engineering and Year 11 and 12 Design and Technology and Senior Visual Arts students. Access to this equipment will also be provided for students across the college.

The TAS faculty would like to take this opportunity to thank the P&C for their on-going support to the upgrading of our school resources to provide our students access to high end technology and enhanced learning opportunities in our classrooms.


