From the Principal

Strategic Improvement Plan (SIP) 2021 - 2024

We extend our high potential and gifted students through enrichment and acceleration opportunities.


2021 will celebrate the 15th anniversary of the awards with a virtual live-stream event on 31 March. For more information on this event, and/or to join

Last week the Year 11 photography class went on an excursion to the Quarantine Station in Manly to explore the theme of 'Historic Landscapes'.





Cashless Payments via **flexischools**

Cashless payments have been implemented for the school canteen via <u>Flexischools</u> to allow students to pay at the canteen using their existing student card.

If you have a Flexischools account, you can now link it to your student card which can be used at the canteen like a debit card. Just add the card number to a student's details under 'Students' in your Flexischools account ('How to' details are at the end of this newsletter). There is also link to Flexischools on the school app under the canteen icon.

Once set up, students can pay for items over the counter at the canteen by scanning the bar code on their card. Easy for the students to use and parents can set daily spending limits.






