From the Principal

Once again, we have been given some enormous challenges after the return to some semblance of normality in the school with the easing of Covid-19 restrictions. I would like to thank the school community for their patience and persistence as we navigate the constant changes.

Upon allowing visitors on site, one of our first activities was to welcome the parents of students new to the school from Year 8 - 11. The Senior Executive, Year Advisers, Head Teacher Wellbeing, as well as the College Principal Mr Dane Ropa, were there to meet the parents and check on the experiences of the new students. Many parents had never stepped inside the school, so it was nice to catch up and listen to the stories of positivity from their students. School Support Officer



A big hello to the Manly Campus School Community, I am the new School Support Officer (SSO) for Manly Campus. In the last couple of weeks, I have been slowly getting to know some students in our school and was delighted to go along to the Year 7 School Camp. I look forward to continuing to get to know the students and year groups in the coming weeks.

What is a SSO?

The role involves working with students, parents, and school staff, as well as community organisations to support student wellbeing at Manly Campus. My goal as an SSO is to work alongside students' social behaviours, as well promote safety, resilience and pro-social behaviours, being a point of call for students to seek advice, guidance, and support. It comprises working with student's one on one, and in small groups. Students can self-refer and may be referred by the Learning Support Team/Wellbeing team, Year Advisers, Head Teachers, Deputy Principals and Principal. A student might be referred to me for support in areas such as study organisation/ strategies, exam support, bullying, developing self-esteem, resilience, conflict resolution, coping skills, peer mediation, or to be connected to local external support and youth services. For more complex issues, referral to the Head Teacher Wellbeing, Principal or the School Counsellors are the most appropriate course of action. It's important to note that I do not provide psychological or intellectual, emotional or behavioural assessments with students. These are the responsibility of the School Counsellors. However, I am part of the team at the school who can help provide wrap-around support for these students.

My background

I have a passion for working with young people and have previously worked in several schools as part of the wellbeing/learning support team. I also have some experience in the Child Protection space working alongside government and non-government organisations, focused on assisting the various needs of children and young people in different capacities. I look forward to meeting with you all and seeing your faces around our school community. I am currently based in the school library, feel free to come and say hi.

3M Robotics



Founded in 2021, the Manly Campus Robotics Team is pleased to announce that not only have we competed at the Australian national championships, but we've managed to bring home the 'Connect Award' for inspiring STEM education too.

With the generous help of the P&C and our residentengineering-experts-TAS-teachers Mr Forsyth and Ms Drew, we participated in the American-Based 'First Tech Challenge', and had little over two months to design, build and test a robot to compete in a series of challenges including the quick collection of 'cargo', little plastic cubes and circles, spin ducks off platforms, drive around autonomously, amongst a host of other problems.

Starting from scratch, a couple robot parts, some wires and a lot of ideas, but somewhat hindered by the fact that the world was raging in pandemic form, the climax of our competition came when our little group of would-be-robotics-engineers sat anxious 11:59:53 on a Friday evening, panicking and trying to submit all of our documentation before the precious seconds ticked away. Not to worry though, with seconds to spare, we were through, and with the lifting of further covid restrictions our small team has grown to a sizable crew, ready to take on a fresh set of challenges.

And the best thing is, doing robotics does not require an inherent passion or even understanding of STEM, one does not need to know how to code or to know what a linear actuator is, it's mostly about improving one's skills time after time, and to build something that is uniquely the team's, with its unique set of problems and brainstormed solutions.

Science - Alumna email

Former Manly Campus student Isobel Ronai emailed our Science Head Teacher Ms Maggs with an update on her career, advising how developing a love of Biology at Manly Campus has shaped her future;

Dear Ms Maggs,

This email is very out of the blue, but I have been meaning to get in contact with you for quite some time now. I am not sure if you would remember me, I was a student in your Year 11/12 Biology class and graduated way back in 2007. A lot has happened since I left Manly, but throughout it all I have maintained my deep love of biology and pursued a career in it.


I completed a Bachelor of Science (Adv) (Joint Honours) in both Biology and History & Philosophy of Science at the University of Sydney. My honours research was in genetics and I also investigated how biologists use the concept of the gene in their research. (To this day, I still remember having classroom debates with you and fellow students about the definition of an allele.) I have attached my honours thesis in case you are interested, you are mentioned in my acknowledgements. I then completed my PhD at the University of Sydney on the genetic and mechanistic basis of worker sterility in the honey bee. During my PhD I had many amazing international research opportunities, in places like the UK, Italy, Germany and the US. I have also attached my PhD thesis in case you are interested, again you are mentioned in my acknowledgments.

After my PhD I decided to change my research area from honey bees to ticks (blood-feeding parasites that have a massive impact on both human and animal health, but we know very little about their biology). I was awarded a postdoctoral fellowship to the tick laboratory group at Columbia University and worked just above the room where Thomas Morgan identified sex linkage in fruit flies, which I first learnt about in your class many years ago! I had been considering staying overseas, but with the pandemic I have been back in Sydney (teaching genetics to undergraduate students at Sydney University, supervising a molecular biology PhD student and also completing a Graduate Certificate in Higher Education). I will soon be leaving Australia again, as I recently accepted a dream job opportunity as postdoctoral fellow in the Department of Organismic and Evolutionary Biology at Harvard University, the top biology department in the world.

So I wanted to reach out to you and let you know that my career (and life) would be in a very different place if I had not fallen in love with biology in your classes all those years ago. Thank you for everything. If there is anything I can do that would be of any help for biology at Manly, please let me know.
