Learning Walks

Strategic Direction 2: Refinement and Development of Teacher Practice and Leadership Capacity

Our purpose is to develop consistent teaching and learning protocols and to use data to effectively evaluate and deliver high quality teaching programs and assessments for High Potential and Gifted students in Stage 4 and 5. We will build instructional leadership capacity to ensure sustained and measurable whole school improvement.

We have been fortunate to be part of a Learning Walk Coalition with five other schools from the Upper Hunter and Beaches Network of schools. As part of this coalition, we are enjoying in some high impact professional learning with Lyn Sharratt, a well-recognised researcher from Canada.

Learning Walks <u>are</u> a tool whereby a team of teachers (trained in the process & protocols) visit classrooms to ask students questions. During this process they are able to gather data on student learning and even learn from each other (teacher practice).

Learning Walks <u>are not</u> a tool for teacher evaluation. They are student- centered but allow teachers to learn from each other as a side product of gathering data on students.

Questions asked:

- What are you learning and why?
- How are you doing?
- How do you know?
- How can you improve?
- Where do you go to for help?



At the end of Term 3, we were honoured to host Lyn Sharratt and representatives from the Department of Education and Principals from the Beaches Network at our school at the end of last term. All classrooms were open for the students to share their learning. I was very proud of how well our students could articulate their responses to questions about their learning and gratitute for the amazing staff we have here at Manly Campus.

This term we have led high impact professional learning for all teaching staff at our school. Following this, all teachers have participated in learning walks to ask students questions about their learning. The following areas were highlighted as celebrations and evidence of success. Collectively as a staff we will now spend some time analysing the patterns and identifying next steps for ongoing improvement to further enhance our pedagogy and students learning in classrooms.

- Learning Intentions and Success Criteria visible in the classroom
- Students could explain what they were learning (learning intentions)
- High levels of student engagement in all classrooms
- Students knew where to go to get help including the teacher, peers, learning adviser, parents, or an older student.
- There was evidence of differentiation including student choice
