Many students in G26 have been working with Band ensembles through the year and demonstrated their commitment with the attendance at performances. The arts have been a point of pride for many students as they participated in musical, drama performances and dance ensembles throughout the year. It is so important to maintain a healthy balance of activities, and alongside their participation in representative sports they are setting a great example for the younger cohorts at the school and setting up good habits in terms of health and activity. The shift away from phones in the playground has seen some students demonstrate more genuine interaction with their peers and engaging more with school life, so I'm thrilled to see this.

We had close to 10 students who achieved bronze or silver awards with the Duke of Edinburgh Competition and the following students achieved Black Opal awards as part of the Department of Education Volunteering Awards, meaning they achieved over 150 hours - Luke, Yukina, Alex, Frankie and Cecilia. Nishka and Eileen achieved over 200 hours of volunteering for the same award.











Head of Careers, Bec Fee, spoke at this year assembly to say how proud she was of the cohort during work experience, receiving fantastic feedback from employers and representing the school with pride. I continue to be very proud of this cohort and their achievements, both inside the classroom and out.

The first three days of next term are very busy for the students as they undertake 'Life Ready', which is a mandatory course designed to prepare and support senior students as they encounter situations related to health and safety as they become more independent and gain more responsibilities. There are 6 main topic areas: Independence, Mental Health and Wellbeing, Respectful Relationships, Sexuality and Sexual Health, Drugs and Alcohol, and Safe Travel. A description of each incursion/ excursion was provided in the cover letter, attached to the online permission note and all students are expected at each session. Year 11 Report



Robotics


Manly Robotics Club Nationals

Regionals: Manly Robotics Club attended the regional FTC Robotics Championships on 2 December at Pymble Ladies College and had outstanding success. They competed through qualifying rounds to be chosen for the First Alliance (of three teams). They subsequently won the semi-final and were heartbreakingly defeated by 1 point in the final. Ruben (G23) is shown with the Finalist Trophy below. This success led to our invitation to the Nationals competition the next weekend.

Nationals: The next week, our Manly "Bampus" robot struggled through Saturday with reliability issues and software misfunction. However, in the

final round, our alliance partner failed and Manly's "Bampus" robot was left to score all the points. The autonomous stage of reading instructions, collecting an item and scoring worked amazingly, the arm functioned smoothly, software was efficient, the plane firing scored maximum points and our robot was the only competitor to achieve the final difficult requirement to hang from a post.



Mega Maths Day

Mega Maths is a day of hands-on activities by the Faculty of Science, Partner Engagement and Outreach, University of Sydney's STEM research teams and current STEM students focusing on mathematics. A day celebrating and showcasing the variety of disciplines and careers that rely on mathematics and how accessible mathematics can be.

Twenty-seven Year 9 students accompanied by Ms Blamires and Mr Dendle, enjoyed the excursion to the University of Sydney, participating in preselected workshops and listening to presentations.

Some feedback from the participating students on the success of the day confirming that 'mathematics is the language with which the universe was written' (Galileo Galilei);



I loved touring the campus of this wonderful University and seeing how what we learn at school can be used on such a large scale in our everyday lives. Each workshop was extremely enlightening and enjoyable, and I learnt

a lot about the implications of mathematics in our daily lives.



I was able to learn about different career paths and get a brief overview over different subjects. Additionally, we did interactive practicals such as identifying species of bugs and insects and calculating the stability of the ecosystem. It was

also an opportunity to explore the campus.

It was a great opportunity to understand daily university life. It was fascinating to visit the science labs and to use real tests in application to solutions. These included using a spec-



trometer to measure change in light intensity and measuring the change in light polarization.



It was super education and lots of fun. Our group participated in 3 workshops – our first one was Creep Crawlies where we investigated a sample of dry and wet leaf litter from the University and tried to find insects to put underneath

a microscope and study. I learnt about a lot of new insects, what they looked like in detail, and I had tons of fun trying to find different insects to look at. We then learnt how to estimate anything, and it was fun to try and guess many of the prompts we were given – there was even a competition to guess as many jellybeans in a jar as possible, and one of our students won. Following that, we went to one of the labs in the University and did some experi-

ments involving sugar, iron and light which were all unique and interesting.



in the 'order and download' box. This will take you to your school's secure online ordering site.



STEP 3

Click on 'Order Photos' and complete your details and procedures. During this process you can place orders for additional children at your school and sibling photos, if available.



cash/envelope ordering

Your school prefers orders to be placed online. However, if you are unable to order online, please complete your order using the order envelope provided.

STEP 1

Complete a separate order envelope for each individual child's package/s ordered. If ordering for more than one child, payment should be enclosed in the envelope of the eldest child and this should be indicated on the envelope of the other child/children (the envelope that does not have cash enclosed).

STEP 2

Enclose exact cash payment in one envelope for the package/s you are ordering. Payment for more than one child should be in the eldest child's envelope and marked at the bottom of the envelope in the space provided.

STEP 3

Return your completed envelope/s, with correct cash payment, to our photographers on the day.

Please note: You must enclose exact correct payment, as change is not available. Credit card payments can only be made online and we no longer accept cheques. There is a separate envelope for sibling photo orders, should your school choose to offer sibling photos.

School photographs will be returned approximately 6 weeks after the day of photography. Please note this delivery timeframe is dependant on proofing and additional photography days at your school.

IMPORTANT - "not for publication" students

If you have instructed your school that your child's image is "not for publication" (sometimes called "do not publish" or "not for media release" instructions), the school will ensure that your child is not presented to our photographers on photo day and school photographs will not be available for purchase. If you wish to change your instruction, then you must notify your school, so they change their records and identify your child as able to be photographed for school photography purposes. All students presented to our photographers by your school on photo day will be photographed, their images will appear in school photography packages with their fellow students and these packages will be available to purchase by all families.
