### **Principal's Report**

### Strategic Improvement Plan (SIP) 2024 – 2027

We are in the final stages of writing our new Strategic Improvement Plan (SIP). The SIP is a working document that details the steps our school will take to improve learning outcomes, and the achievement and growth of all students. To ensure continuous improvement, the SIP reflects where our school is at and how it will further improve learning, teaching and leading.

# NSW School Vaccination Program 2024

### Northern Beaches Secondary College Manly Campus

NSW Health works in partnership with schools to offer the vaccines recommended and funded for adolescents by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) in a school-based vaccination program. A team of nurses visit the school for vaccination clinics, which are held during school hours.

The following vaccines will be offered at school clinics at Manly Campus this year:

- Year 10- Meningococcal ACWY, school clinic, 2 April 2024
- Year 7 diptheria-tetanus-pertussis (dTpa), school clinic, 30 May 2024
   Human Papilloma Virus (HPV), school clinic, 4 July 2024

Consent for each vaccine must be provided by parents/guardians for students to receive free vaccinations at school.

Parents/guardians can provide consent online following the instructions below.

Please take care to ensure all details are correct, including selecting the correct school, otherwise the nurses will not be able to access the consent form.

Vaccination will only be provided at school if consent has been received. How to provide consent:

- 1. To complete online consent for your child's school vaccinations, visit: <a href="https://nswhealth.service-now.com/school">https://nswhealth.service-now.com/school</a> and log in using your ServiceNSW details. This is the same account you may already use to renew your driver's licence. Refer to <a href="https://service.ncm/s
- 2. Update or confirm your personal details in ServiceNSW as required.
- 3. Complete the School Vaccination Consent Form for your child.

Read a step-by-step guide on how to provide consent online. Translated guides are available in <u>Arabic</u>, <u>Korean</u>, <u>Simplified Chinese</u>, <u>Traditional Chinese</u>, <u>Vietnamese</u>.

If you or your child do not have a Medicare card or access, consent can still be provided by requesting a paper-based consent form directly from your child's school.

### The benefits of providing consent online:

- easily update your child's details
- receive SMS and/or email notifications when vaccinations are given
- faster upload of vaccination records to the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR).

### **Debating**

Year 8 students participated in a Global Debating Competition.

From the 10-12 of February, schools, and teams from all around the world try to claim the champion title for the annual Stanford World Schools Debating competition.

My friends and I were lucky enough to have the opportunity to participate in this competition a few weeks back. Since the debates were primarily set in American time zones, we had to wake up at 3am to debate for up to 12 hours for three consecutive days.

World schools is open to high schools or tutoring centres from any country with an invitation.

Some of the schools we competed against included Harvard-Westlake in LA, DPS school in Singapore, as well as others in Canada, Russia, and more. We competed as Cogito Tutoring, who had 9 teams entered out of the 150 teams invited. By the semifinals, only Cogito (representing Australia) were still standing. As a result, Australia secured its first win since 2013.

Topics covered controversial global issues such as "This house supports Bukele's plan on gang violence"; "This house believes that the language of the former colonisers should no longer be the official language in their former colonies"; "This house regrets the rise of first-world feminism".

These required our team to research a wide range of themes within varying time limits. The format was also slightly different from normal debating processes.

Overall, this was a really great experience and outcome for our team and useful practice for future debates. I really look forward to this competition again next year and would encourage everyone to join if they can.


